There will be a guided tour of exhibits, followed by a panel discussion. National social work leaders will speak briefly concerning job opportunities in the several fields of social work. ANOTHER QUESTIONNAIRE !

The College and University Department of the National Catholic Education Association is making a study of the amount of publishing done by faculty members, of Catholic colleges and universities, over the three years previous, 1954-56 inclusive.

As complete a listing as possible of the scholarly publications appearing from the pens of faculty members in Catholic institutions of higher education during the stated period will provide an excellent point of departure for intelligent planning for the years ahead. Weaknesses are apparent, but it is hoped that areas of strength will also be discovered. We feel that this study will provide a strong stimulus towards a concerted effort in our institutions to publish the fruits of scholarly study and research.

Data requested for the preparation of a monograph on the amount of publishing done by the faculty members of Catholic colleges and universities during the three-year period, 1954-1956.

Time period of this study: The calendar years 1954-1956 inclusive.

Authors All authors should be listed who actually were faculty members during one or more of the years, 1954-1956. Include only those publications which they produced while members of the faculty of a Catholic college or university. Please state total number of faculty for each year.

Types of publications to be included in the study:

A) Books - Give complete title of book; author, highest degree earned, academic position in a Catholic institution at the time of publication of book, including school, e.g., graduate, education, arts and sciences, etc.; number of pages, publisher, and year of publication. Brief summary of content desirable.

B) Monographs - Give complete title of monograph; author, highest degree earned, academic position in a Catholic institution at the time of publication of the monograph, including school, e.g., graduate, education arts and sciences, etc.; number of pages, publisher, and year of publication. Brief summary of content desirable.

C) Scholarly articles in professional periodicals - Give complete title of article, author, highest degree earned, academic position in a Catholic institution at the time of publication of the article, including school, e.g., graduate, education, arts and sciences, etc.; number of pages, publisher, and year of publication. Brief synopsis of article desirable.

D) Scholarly articles appearing in other than professional periodicals - Give complete title of article, author, highest degree earned, academic position in a Catholic institution at the time of publication of the article; including school, e.g., graduate, education, arts and sciences, etc.; number of pages, publisher, and year of publication. Brief synopsis of article desirable.

N.B. --- Do not list book reviews, catalogues or brochures, religious bulletins, pamphlets, hectographed class notes, etc.
