### STAG REUNION

Contrary to rumors spread last year, the Annual Alumni Stag Reunion is not dead. Neither has the basic format changed. The female alums who attended last year were warmly welcomed, and it is hoped that more of them will participate this year.

As a special added attraction, Hayman Hall, the new physical facilities building, will be open for alumni use between 6:30 and 8:30 P.M. on Stag night.

The \$18.50 per couple charge includes an open bar (9 P.M. to 1 A.M.), a buffet, and \$3 worth of chips to start the evening.

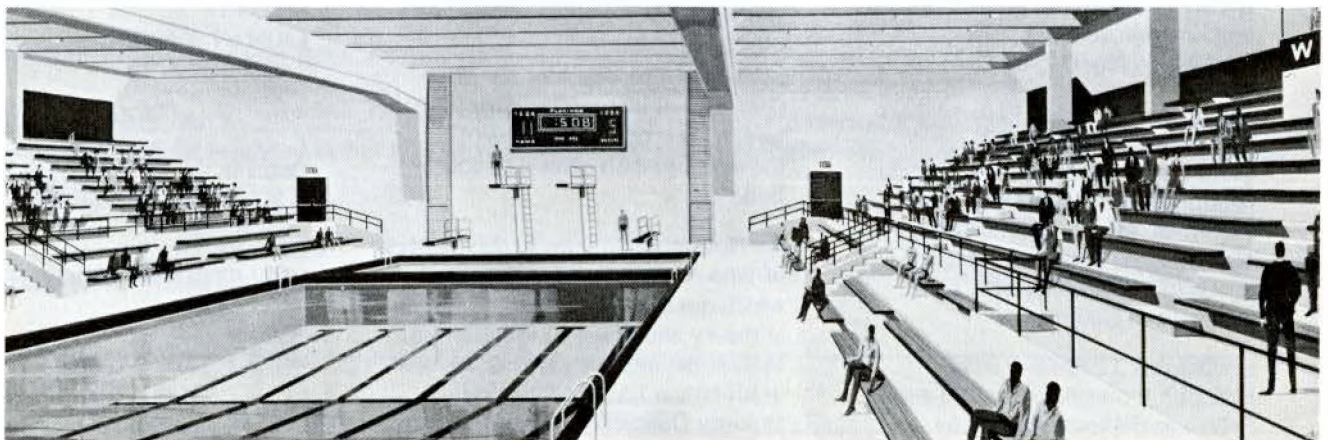

## CONCERT & LECTURE SERIES

Brother Emery C. Mollenhauer, Vice President for Academic Affairs, has announced the concert and lecture series for the coming semester. Alumni are cordially invited to attend all programs. (Except those noted, they begin at 12:30 P.M.)

*John R. Bunting*, Chairman of the First Pennsylvania Corp., will inaugurate the School of Business Administration's Lindback Executive Lecture Series on Sept. 14. This series will bring top-level leaders from business and industry to the College to discuss many aspects of the current business scene and the relations of business enterprise to society. The Lindback Executive Lecture Series is made possible through grants from the Lindback Foundation and Abbotts Dairies.

On Sept. 19 *Edith Efron*, Contributing Editor to *TV Guide*, commentator and media critic for Public Broadcasting Radio, will discuss her book: *The News Twisters*, an analysis of the television network news coverage of the 1968 Presidential campaign.

At 8:30 P.M. on Sept. 21, in Olney Hall 100, the guest speaker will be Pa. Representative *Hardy Williams*. Mr. Williams, who sought the Democratic mayoralty nomination in 1971, is the president of the northeast region of Black Elected Officials and the Pennsylvania representative to the steering Committee of the National Black Political Convention.

*Betty Friedan*, leader of the Women's Liberation movement, will appear on September 28.

*Robert N. Winter-Berger* will discuss his controversial book, *The Washington Pay-Off*, on October 3.

The present status of Philadelphia International Airport and plans for future development of its facilities will be the topic of *August B. Brough* on October 5. Mr. Brough is Assistant Director of Aviation in Philadelphia's Department of Commerce.

On October 12 *Philip Young*, Research Professor of English and Fellow in the Institute for the

Arts and Humanities at Penn State, and an authority on Ernest Hemingway, will present a talk entitled "Big World Out There: *The Nick Adams Stories*."

*R. Sturgis Ingersoll*, lawyer, collector and patron of the arts, will discuss the current status of "The Arts in Philadelphia" on October 19.

On October 24, *The Philadelphia Trio* (pianist Deidre Irons, violinist Barbara Sonies, and cellist Deborah Reeder) will be featured in concert.

*Anthony Burgess*, author of *A Clockwork Orange*, will analyze "The Nature of Comedy" on October 31.

On November 1 *Ann Bengis*, a public information specialist for the Nixon administration's Price Commission, will discuss both the goals and methods of the Commission and some aspects of her own work in communicating those goals.

*The Philharmonia Orchestra*, Ling Tung conducting, will return for a third performance on Thursday, November 9, at 8:30 P.M.

History Professor *John Lukacs* will talk on "Opportunism Among Intellectuals" on Nov. 16.

On November 28 *Joseph Daughren* and *Peter Binzen*, reporters for the *Philadelphia Bulletin* and co-authors of *The Wreck of the Penn-Central*, will discuss the story told in their book and some of the developments since its publication.

On November 30 *Donald Barr*, author of *Who Pushed Humpty Dumpty?*, which questions prevailing educational theory and practise, will attempt to look beyond the scope of his book in his talk at LaSalle, "Putting Humpty Dumpty Together."
