#### **LA SALLE BASKETBALL — 1970-71**

The 1970-71 edition of La Salle basketball will feature a 24 game schedule, highlighted by the lifting of the two-year NCAA probation, and the Explorers' return to post-season tournament eligibility.

According to the schedule announced by athletic director, John J. Conboy, coach Paul Westhead's La Salle five will play 12 of their 24 games on the road, including a 2-game appearance in the Charlotte Invitational in Charlotte, N.C. on December 29 and 30 (Teams entered: Boston College, Davidson, Georgia, and La Salle).

In addition, La Salle will make an appearance in Madison Square Garden, December 5 (vs. Long Island University). On January 4, the Explorers will open the new year with a trip to Tulsa, Oklahoma, to encounter the University of Tulsa. In their only previous meeting, Tulsa defeated La Salle, 46-36 (1940).

Other road games include contests with: Albright College (Dec. 2); West Chester State (Dec. 15); Niagara University (Jan. 20); Lafayette (Jan. 25); Drexel (Jan. 28); Syracuse (Feb. 6); American University (Feb. 24); and Rider College (March 1).

Colorful Palestra opponents include: Miami (Dec. 9); Marshall (Dec. 12); Western Kentucky (Jan. 16), Canisius (Feb. 10); Duquesne (Feb. 17); and Creighton (Feb. 19) with All-American candidate, Cyril Baptiste.

Rounding out the home schedule will be games with Hofstra (Jan. 30) and Loyola of the South (Feb. 13).

The Middle Atlantic Conference playoffs to determine the MAC representative to the NCAA tournament will be held March 5-6, at the "Palestra."
