Faculty who will be able to participate should make arrangements with Mr. Ronald Armitage in the Properties Office, to order the academic robes which may be needed. The deadline for placing this order is Tuesday, October 7, 1958.

A luncheon will follow the Convocation but we are forced by space limitations to limit our invitations to Departmental Chairmen. We regret this, and hope you understand our disappointment in not being able to enjoy your company at the luncheon.

## FACULTY FELLOWSHIPS

We have recently received several announcements of fellowships of interest to the Faculty. Among these is The Ford Foundation's Foreign Area Training Fellowship Program for 1959-60. The announcement is on file in the Counseling Center. Requests for application forms should be sent to The Secretary, The Ford Foundation, Foreign Area Training Fellowships, 477 Madison Avenue (15th Floor), New York 22, N. Y.

Another offer is the National Science Foundation program of Science Faculty Fellowships.

These fellowships are offered by the foundation to individuals planning additional scientific study and/or research with a view to improving themselves as teachers of science, mathematics, or engineering. Fellowships are awarded in the mathematical, physical, medical, biological, engineering and other sciences, including interdisciplinary fields such as biochemistry and geophysics. The fellowships are available to citizens of the United States who (a) hold a baccalaureate degree or its equivalent, (b) have demonstrated ability and special aptitude for science teaching and advanced training, (c) have had not less than three years' experience in teaching science (as a full-time staff member of instructor or higher rank, teaching undergraduate students mainly) at the collegiate level, and (d) intend to continue teaching.

Stipends are individually determined, the aim being to provide an award approximately equivalent to what the Fellow's normal salary would be for the period of tenure. Maximum awards are based on a rate of \$12,000 per annum. Tenure options range from three to fifteen months. Further details are contained in the announcement, a copy of which is being mailed to your department(s).

In addition to the Science Faculty Fellowships, the National Science Foundation offers predoctoral, regular postdoctoral, and senior postdoctoral fellowships.

Further information may be obtained from Mr. Harry C. Kelly, Assistant Director for Scientific Personnel and Education of the National Science Foundation, Washington 25, D.C.

Still another fellowship available is the Danforth Teacher Study Grant. It is designed to assist the young teacher (25-40 years) to finish his graduate work for the Doctor's Degree. The applicant may be teaching in any field, and must have had three years of teaching experience. The Grant provides one-half the full-time salary, plus one-sixth of his salary for each dependent up to a maximum of \$4800. In addition, the appointee is given tuition and all other official fees.

The candidate for this fellowship must be appointed by the Dean of the College. If any Faculty Members are interested in applying for this fellowship, please contact the Dean of the College for additional information. The deadline for contacting the Dean is October 10, 1958.

DR. FLUBACHER RE-ELECTED

Dr. Joseph Flubacher was re-elected as faculty representative of the School of Arts and Sciences on the Committee of Academic Affairs on a ballot in which 71 per cent of the faculty voted.

LA SALLE COLLEGE INVITED TO PRESENT RADIO SERIES
