INTERRUPTIONS TO CLASSES (Office of the President)

In recent meetings the Academic Affairs Committee has been considering some instances of interruptions to classes. In many, if not all, cases these interruptions are occasioned by worthwhile activities, but the practice has been laid open to some abuse.

The principle that no class period should be disturbed without the authorization of the Dean of the College is brought to your attention.

One matter of particular concern is the question of "collections" in the classes. In principle, collections should never be taken up in the College classes. However, some extraordinary circumstances may occasionally justify an exception to this policy.

WITHDRAWALS AND FAILURES (Office of the Dean)

A student listed on your official class list should be given a withdrawal grade only in those cases where he presents you with a withdrawal slip from the Deans' Office.

Students who simply "drop out", either before or after the last permissible date for withdrawal, should be assigned an "F".

SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS (Deans' Office)

Faculty members are reminded to submit, through their Department Chairman, copies of their final examinations to the Deans' Office - C103.

TEXT BOOKS FOR SECOND SEMESTER (Office of the Dean)

Should there be any faculty member who has not submitted to the Book Store the titles of texts to be used in the second semester classes, we would appreciate it if you would get this information to Mr. Kerr at your earliest convenience.
