RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE - (Office of the Dean of Students)

During the past year there have been many requests for donations of blood by the relatives of our faculty and student body. Fortunately the Red Cross took care of all of these very promptly, providing that the persons requesting blood were connected with a group or organization which had fulfilled its quota allotment. This was accomplished at no cost to those who needed blood.

On March 23rd from 9:30 A.M. till 2:30 P.M., in the Library Lounge, the Red Cross Blood Donor Corps will be prepared to take care of ten persons every fifteen minutes.

LECTURE (Office of the Dean of the College)

"Problems Facing the West" is the title of the 1959 Owen J. Roberts Memorial Lecture to be delivered by Paul Henri Spaak, Secretary-General of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, on Tuesday evening March 31. The lecture is sponsored by the University of Pennsylvania Law School and its chapter of The Order of the Coif, a national honorary legal society.

The lecture will begin at 8:00 p.m. at the Sheraton Hotel, Philadelphia. It is open to the public without charge but tickets must be requested in advance by writing to the University of Pennsylvania Law School, 3400 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia 4, Pennsylvania. Reservations for cocktails and dinner preceding the lecture may also be made through the Law School at a cost of ten dollars per person.
