## LA SALLE COLLEGE FACULTY BULLETIN

### MIDDLE STATES EVALUATION

The dates for the Middle States evaluation have been set for the period beginning with February 20 and ending on February 23, Mr. Richard H. Logsdon, Director of Libraries at Columbia University, has been designated as the Chairman of the visiting committee. The personnel of the committee has not, as yet, been reported.

According to our present schedule in preparing for this visit, the first draft of the report will be in the hands of each member of the faculty during the first week of December. This will enable members of the faculty to study the report carefully. The meeting of the faculty scheduled for December 15th will be devoted to a discussion of this report.

### FOUNDATION OF PENNSYLVANIA COLLEGES

During the week of November 15th, presidents of the forty-odd member colleges of the Foundation of Independent Colleges of the State of Pennsylvania carried on an intensive campaign of solicitation in the Western part of the state. Teams of two college presidents were assigned a daily quota of corporation and industry heads to visit and to solicit their aid. Last year, La Salle's share of the money received came to about \$1,200.00; the year before \$750. Present indications give reason to hope for a successful venture which could be realized within the next ten years. Last summer, U.S. Steel announced a \$700,000 appropriation to be given to institutions of higher learning in those areas where U.S. Steel had interest. The Pennsylvania Foundation received \$41,000 as its share. Should other corporations follow in this leadership, as it is hoped, higher education can look forward to a new source of financial aid.
