Last year on Las Vegas Night the Phillies engaged the Los Angeles Dodgers in a nationally televised National League playoff game in the famous October monsoon at Veteran's Stadium. Despite this one-two punch and a resulting drop in attendance, faithful Vegas fans turned out for what has become the highlight of the Fall social season for our Alumni Association.

This year's Las Vegas committee, under Chairman Eugene L. Kelly, '58, in seeking to avoid that type of conflict, has scheduled the event for Saturday evening, September 30.

The eighth annual Las Vegas Night will commence at 9:00 p.m. in the College Union Ballroom. The \$15.00 per person charge includes open bar all evening, buffet, dancing, \$1.00 in free chips, and a variety of outstanding door prizes.

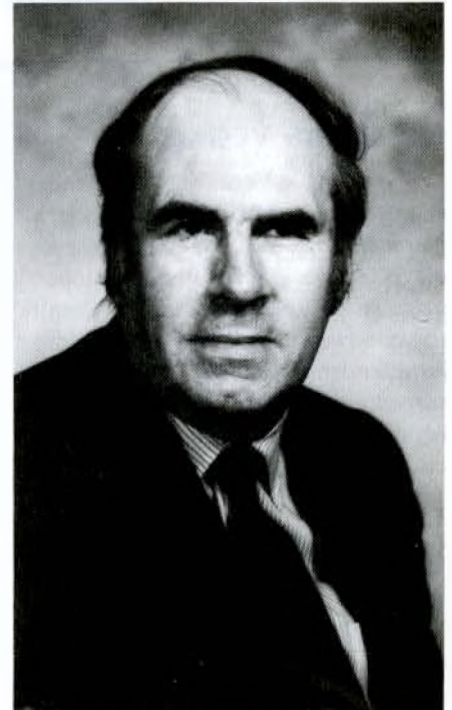
