

THE AUTHOR

WESLEY BURROWES is a thirty-nine year old Ulsterman, who has been writing professionally for eight years. His first theatre venture was the musical CARRIE, which ran for seven weeks in Dublin at the Olympia Theatre, as a part of the Dublin Theatre Festival of 1963, and which has since been produced in America on the West Coast, and in television versions, in Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Sweden, and Hungary. In 1964, he wrote a revue which was included in the Festival, and in 1969, his name again was featured in its billings with his play YOU IN YOUR SMALL CORNER. On Irish television, he is best known for his work on the popular serial THE RIORDANS, now in its seventh season. In 1965, he won a Jacobs Award for his contributions to television drama; in 1967, with Michael Coffey, the Eurovision Song Contest, and last year, the coveted Irish Life Award in Drama for tonight's play. He is represented in the new Award contest with a script which the Abbey Theatre has already set for production this season. Because it is, by contest rules, entered under a nom-de-plume, its title cannot yet be announced.
