Father Sirico draws upon theology, philosophy, and history to outline the contours of the entrepreneurial vocation and its relationship with the deeper Christian message, one that affirms incomparable dignity of the human person and the betterment of the world through human work. This presentation offers a moral, intellectual and inspirational affirmation of enterprise.

**7:00 PM ♦ *The Morality of Enterprise***

Approaching the question of business 'from within,' Father Sirico will demonstrate how recent business scandals are really a betrayal of the very nature of enterprise and its worthy calling. He proposes a virtue-based ethics approach, as opposed to the moral relativism that poses as business ethics in many academic circles. The logic of enterprise, Fr. Sirico argues, requires transparency, honesty, and virtue.

Rev. Robert A. Sirico is co-founder and president of the Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty, a non-profit, non-partisan, free-market educational organization. Since 1990, the Acton Institute has been on the forefront of educating future religious leaders about the principles of the market economy as encapsulated in Pope John Paul II's 1991 social encyclical *Centesimus Annus*.

Father Sirico's writings on religious, political, economic, and social matters have been published in a variety of journals and newspapers, including, the *Journal of Markets and Morality*, *New York Times*, and *Wall Street Journal*. Sirico has been called upon by CNN, ABC, the BBC, NPR, CBS' *60 Minutes*, and other members of the news media for statements regarding economics, civil rights, and issues of religious concern, and has been quoted in both domestic and international news publications.

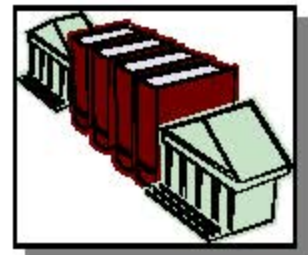

- PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING: Graphics submitted may be resized to fit the document layout. Logos, signatures, and other graphics that are likely to be used frequently can be kept on file for future use. Please add a comment to this effect when you submit your graphic.
