### Health Advisory Committee Minutes

December 16, 2005 (rescheduled from Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> due to snow)

#### I. Smoking

- a. Progress continues to be made. La Salle University's facilities will all be smoke free by Fall 2006.
- b. "No smoking" signage is still missing from building entrances. This needs to be followed up on.
- c. The issue of moving ashtrays away from building entrances was brought to the attention of Physical Facilities. Ralph Carey responded that he will pursue moving outdoor ashtrays 15 – 20 feet from doorways.
- d. An administrator approached a member of the Health Advisory Committee with the observation that he noted an abundance of female students smoking. He suggested that the Health Advisory Committee address raising awareness of the health impact of smoking on women in particular.

#### II. Health Tip of the Month

- a. MaryAnne Peters has done a great job placing pertinent tips in Campus News and on the portal.
- b. Ideas for upcoming 'tips' were suggested (physical fitness, healthy relationships, etc.).

#### III. Healthy Objectives 2010

- a. The Nutritional HAC sub committee with membership from Food Services, HAC committee and the Nutrition department has designed a logo to be placed on 'healthy choices' in the various food venues. However, logistics are still being worked out as to initiating this idea.
- b. **FITNET** is on the portal. This is a channel of the portal devoted to health and exercise. Campus recreational activities will be advertised here as well as pertinent fitness information will be available.
- c. The Health Advisory Committee is considering initiating an University wide walking program in the Spring Semester in which university members will be encouraged to walk on the track during the Universal Free time period. Logs to keep track of distances will be included with possible incentives to take part in this activity. This idea is still in the planning stages.
- d. Exercise classes will be initiated in the Spring Semester with information about this found through FITNET.
- e. Angie Marfisi informed the committee that over the Winter break, the Fitness Center will be getting new equipment.
