College To Host Writing Conference

La Salle College will host the spring conference of the Delaware Valley Writing Council on Saturday, March 6.

Organized under the topic "Designing Writing Assignments," the conference will feature twenty panels, three workshops, and formal presentations by some fifty college and high school teachers of writing. The keynote address will be delivered by David Bartholomae, Professor of English at the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Margot Soven, of the La Salle English and Communications Arts Department, is chairing the conference. Brother President Patrick Ellis will give the welcoming address.
