## U.S. Cabinet Official, President of AFSCME, and Executive Director of ACCU To Be Honored at Commencement

The Secretary of Health and Human Services, the president of the nation's largest public employee union, and a prominent educational leader will be honored at La Salle University's 128th Commencement at 1:00 P.M. on Sunday, May 12 at the Philadelphia Civic Center/Convention Hall.

Louis W. Sullivan, M.D., the Secretary of Health and Human Services, will receive an honorary doctor of humanities degree. Gerald W. McEntee, international president of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), AFL-CIO, will be awarded an honorary doctor of laws degree. Sister Alice Gallin, OSU, Ph.D., executive director of the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities, will be given an honorary doctor of humane letters degree.

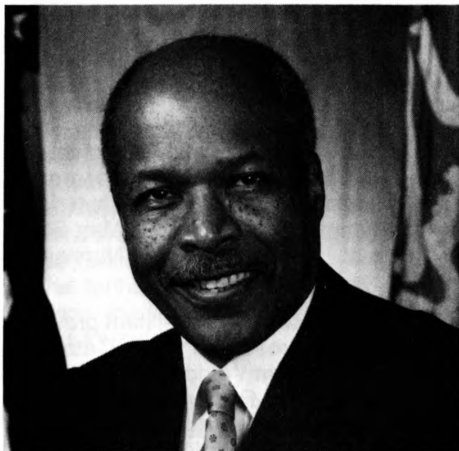
Dr. Sullivan will be sponsored for his degree by Mrs. Josephine C. Mandeville, a member of La Salle's Board of Trustees. McEntee's sponsor will be Dr. Joseph F. Flubacher, secretary of the university's Board of Trustees. Sister Gallin will be sponsored by Brother Colman Coogan, F.S.C., provincial of the Brothers of the Christian Schools and a trustee of the university.

La Salle University's Brother President Patrick Ellis, F.S.C., Ph.D., will confer bachelor's degrees on 1,012 men and women including 229 Evening Division students. Another 148 men and women will receive master's degrees in business administration; 21 will earn master's degrees in nursing; 20 will be awarded master's degrees in bilingual/bicultural studies (Spanish); 18 will receive master's degrees in religious education; 17 will earn master's degrees in pastoral counseling; 14 will be the first to receive master's degrees in human services psychology; 11 will be awarded master's degrees in education, and nine will receive master's degrees in organization/management.

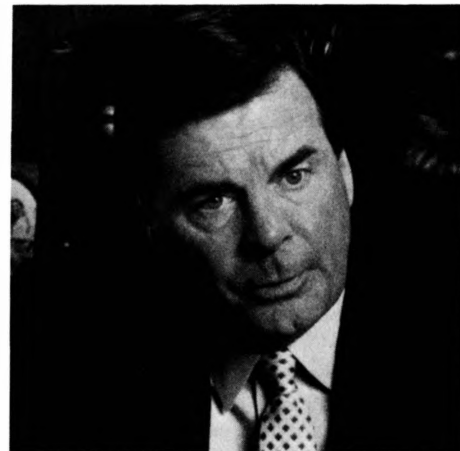
Dr. Sullivan, who was appointed to the Cabinet by President George Bush in 1989, oversees the federal agency responsible for the major health, welfare, food and drug safety, medical research and income security programs serving the American people. He came to HHS from the Morehouse School of Medicine in his native Atlanta where he had been founding dean and director of that college's Medical Education Program.

A 1954 magna cum laude graduate of Morehouse, Dr. Sullivan earned his medical degree from Boston University in 1958. Since then he has taught at his alma mater, Harvard Medical School, New Jersey College of Medicine, and Boston University School of Medicine. He also served as co-director of hematology at Boston University Medical Center, project director of the Boston Sickle Cell Center, and director of hematology at Boston City Hospital.

Among his many professional activities, Dr. Sullivan was the founding president of the Association of Minority Health Professions Schools and a former member of the Joint Committee on Health Policy of the Association of American Universities and the National Association of Land Grant Col-

Sister Gallin, a member of the Order of St. Ursula, has been executive director of ACCU, an organization of more than 200 institutions, since 1980. Before that she served as a teacher, specializing in European History, a dean and administrator for more than 25 years at the College of New Rochelle, in New York.

Sister Gallin earned her bachelor's degree from the College of New Rochelle, a master's degree from Fordham University, and a Ph.D. from The Catholic University of America. She has published two books as well as a number of articles and book reviews and is currently a trustee at the College of New Rochelle, the University of Notre Dame, and St. Bonaventure University.

leges and Universities. He was a member of then-Vice President Bush's official 12 member delegation to seven African countries in 1982.

McEntee, who has served as international president of the 1.2 million member AFSCME, in Washington, D.C., since 1981, previously had a distinguished career as a labor leader in Pennsylvania. Beginning in 1958 as an AFSCME organizer in Philadelphia, he became the successful architect of the major public sector drive to unionize Pennsylvania's 75,000 state employees.

A native of Philadelphia and a 1956 graduate of La Salle where he majored in economics, McEntee is a vice president of AFL-CIO and a member of its Executive Council. He is also a member of the Democratic National Committee, co-founder and chairman of the Board of the Washington-based Economic Policy Institute, and co-founder of Project 500, a national effort to retain progressive majorities in state legislatures across the country.

### La Salle's Final ROTC Commissioning Ceremony

La Salle's final U.S. Army Officers Training Corps (ROTC) commissioning ceremony for seven new officers will be held at 10 A.M. on Saturday, May 11, in the Dunleavy Assembly Room. Major General William F. Burns (retired), a 1954 La Salle graduate who served under President Reagan as director of the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, will be guest speaker.

U.S. Army officials announced last July that 50 ROTC units in 27 states, including La Salle's, would be closed at the end of the 1990-91 academic year. Since 1950, La Salle's ROTC unit has produced about 1,000 new second lieutenants.
