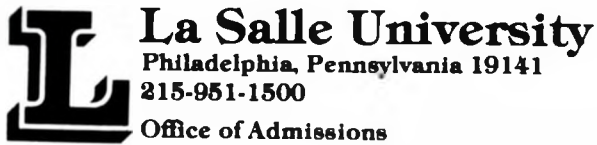

RE: Facilitator Training Program for "FreshStart" Quit Smoking Program
of the American Cancer Society

On Thursday, January 16, 1992, from 3 to 6 p.m. in St. George Lounge, representatives from the American Cancer Society will come to campus to train facilitators, who will then be able to run the "FreshStart" quit smoking program on campus in the future. The training of facilitators is **free!!** The criteria for selection of a "FreshStart" facilitator is as follows:

1. Individual should be committed generally to the maintenance of health through good self-care, and specifically to the fact that it is most important for individuals to stop smoking.
2. Individual enjoys and is at ease working with groups and possesses good communication skills.
3. Individual possesses important personal qualities such as a strong empathic ability, perceptiveness, a good sense of humor, and an ability to speak directly and simply.

All facilitators must be non-smokers, it is preferred, but not required, that the facilitator be an ex-smoker (defined as having been off cigarettes for at least six months.) Ex-smokers can be empathic and thus more effective in helping smokers quit.

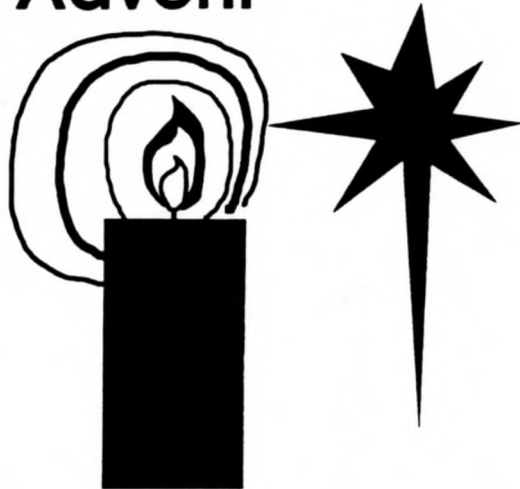
