

Your next presentation or professional engagement can include an electric slide show.

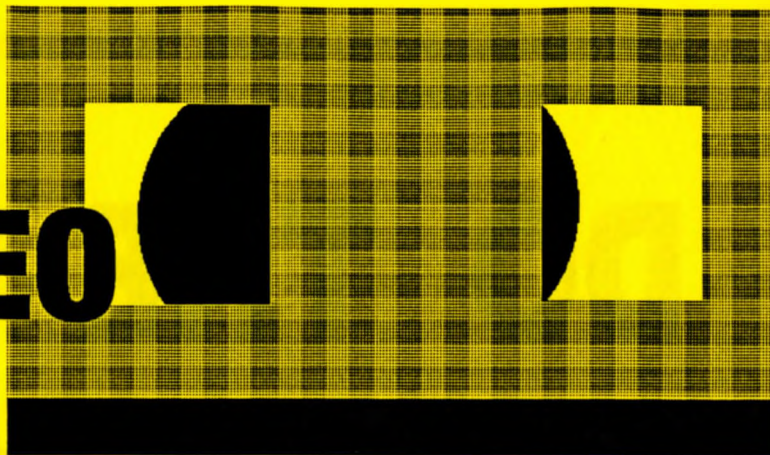
