CONCERT AND LECTURE SERIES

BEFORE FOREVER

Danceteller, a modern-dance theater company of five performers which tours nationally, will perform **BEFORE FOREVER** here at La Salle University on **Sunday, October 13, at 2:00 p.m. in the Dan Rodden Theatre** in the Union Building. **BEFORE FOREVER** is a full-length work of art about the human side of the AIDS epidemic that has swept across America.

"With AIDS, there comes a time when all the statistics begin to seem unreal," says Danceteller Company Manager David Collins. "What's missing is the human stuff, the dreams, the anger, the courage. This is a work of art that reminds us that we are all human, and that we have to work together to solve this thing, whether we have the disease or not."

Danceteller, which performed first in 1976, combines dance and theater in **BEFORE FOREVER**. The performers appear as dancers who speak, much as actors would do in a play. Based in Philadelphia, the ensemble has performed for a half-million audience members in more than a thousand theaters across the U.S.

BEFORE FOREVER, in two acts, was created by choreographer Trina Collins, playwright Robert Barnett, and composer Micki Rossi in April, 1988. All of the words for the script were drawn from a series of eighteen tape-recorded interviews of people living with AIDS in the Delaware Valley. At points during the performance, the dancers speak the words of the script. At other moments, the actual voices recorded during the interviews are heard while the performers are dancing.

At the premiere performances of **BEFORE FOREVER** in 1988, audience members were invited to fill out comment cards. One person wrote, "Oscar Wilde said that if you tell the truth, people are bound to find out. Thank you for telling the truth." Another person, apparently someone's husband who had been dragged along to the concert reluctantly, said, "I thought I'd be depressed but I was wrong. I never thought I'd like it so much." On tour, the work has been greeted with standing ovations.

The Washington Post wrote that the work is "an always touching theatrical event." The reviewer for Philadelphia's City Paper wrote, "**BEFORE FOREVER** is an eloquent, beautiful work. It is never preachy or pretentious. The connections between the music, the movement, and the words are seamless. It is often funny, always hopeful, and profoundly human."

Critics have also raved about the work on the West Coast. The reviewer for the San Francisco Chronicle wrote, "**BEFORE FOREVER** is a powerful blend of dance and theatre. It is also one of those rare theatre pieces in which dramatic themes are illuminated and extended by dance movement...the hardest of hearts would be moved."
