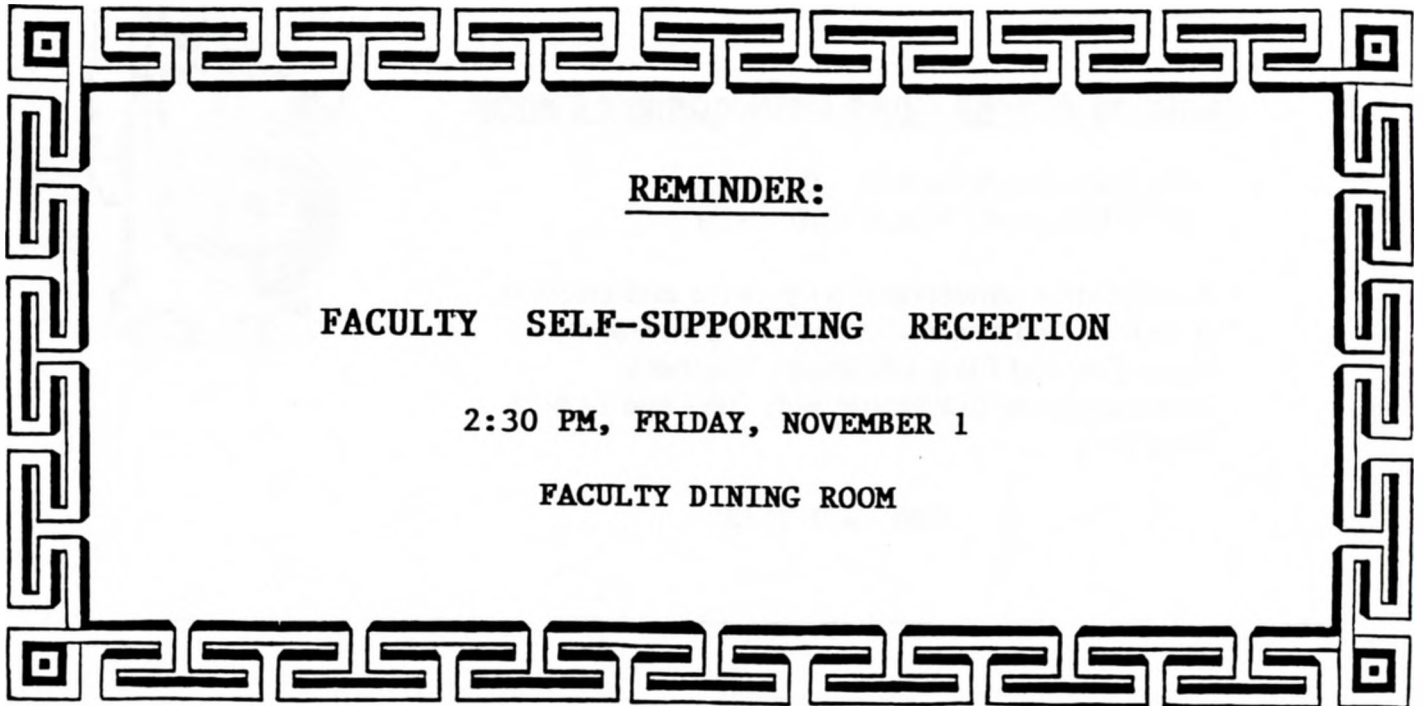

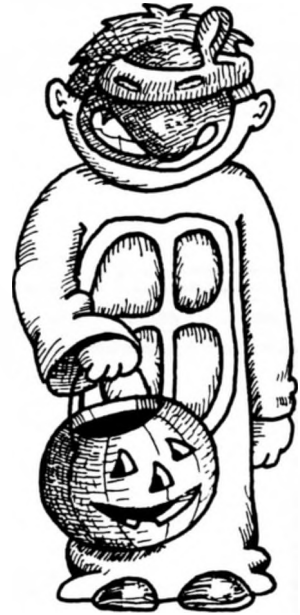


Correction to La Salle University Telephone Directory

HIGHLIGHTS

October 7, 1991

I. ENROLLMENT REPORT

The Vice President for Enrollment Services presented a summary which showed a decline of 6.4% in total undergraduate enrollment, an increase of 2.4% in graduate enrollment, and a composite decline of 4.8%. Total enrollment at the fall census date was 6,029.

Financial aid was cited as the most readily identifiable factor influencing Day School enrollment results.

II. FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 1990-91

The Vice President for Business Affairs reported that some better than budgeted results in non-tuition revenues and some considerable savings in certain expenditures resulted in a modest excess of revenues over expenditures.

III. INITIAL BUDGET PROJECTION FOR 1991-92

The Vice President for Business Affairs reported that translation of enrollment figures into financial terms and a projection based on recent historical experience indicate a shortfall of revenue versus budgeted expenditures. Some adjustments have been made to reduce that projected deficit and continued attention will be given to other steps to improve the outcome.

IV. UNIVERSITY SMOKING POLICY

A proposed policy to make the University a smoke-free environment was reviewed.

The Faculty Senate was requested to offer comment on the proposed policy in time for action at Council's next meeting.

Council's next meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 4, at 2:30 p.m.

To access AIQN, follow these underlined keystroke commands on computers #10511 or #10512 in room 109 Connelly, first floor.

These two (2) commands will place you in the AIQN system. Once in, follow the on screen instructions. You can choose between three (3) separate programs:

1. "Spirited Information" is everything you ever wanted to know about alcohol and its consumption.
2. "Alcohol IQ Quest" is a trivia game based upon the information provided in #1.
3. "Private Stock" offers the opportunity to review your own alcohol use habits and identify any low/high risk drinking behaviors you may engage in.

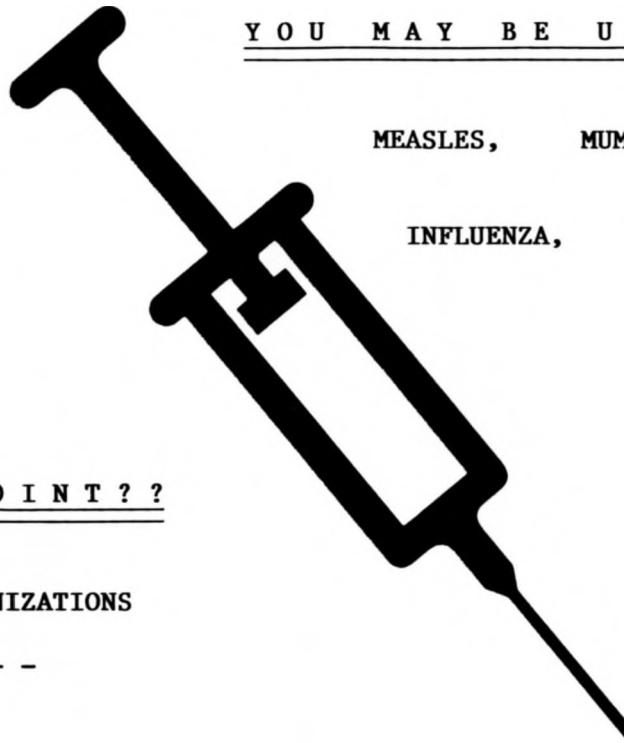
