As you plan for the Fall Semester, consider what library skills your students will need to be successful in your class.


The library is committed to an active role in helping students develop effective research skills.

Re: Faculty Dining Room Change in Service Format

As a part of the 1992-1993 budget process, the Food Service Department was directed to implement cost reduction actions and to adjust charges to more approximate the cost of the service delivered. In order to respond to this, the student meal plans have been completely revised. Also, beginning Wednesday, September 9, 1992 there will be changes in the menu and service format in the Faculty Dining Room. A la carte service will be eliminated and the FDR will offer buffet service. Each day from 11:30-2:00pm, soup, deli selections, breads and rolls, specialty salads, hot entrees, dessert and beverages will be available. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding. We solicit constructive observation and would welcome your comments.

Pricing will be as follows;

**Full Buffet** \$ 5.75  
(includes all items except sodas and bottled beverages)

**Full Hot Buffet** \$ 4.50  
(includes hot items; chafing dish selections, breads and rolls, hot beverages, iced tea)

**Full Cold Buffet** \$ 3.95  
(includes all cold selections; deli station, garden and fruit salad bowl, specialty salads, breads and rolls, hot beverages, iced tea)

**Deli Buffet** \$ 3.75  
(unlimited trips to the deli station which includes meats and cheeses and sandwich accompaniments; breads and rolls station, and soup OR garden salad bowl, hot beverages, iced tea)

**Salad Buffet** \$ 3.00  
(unlimited trips to the garden salad bowl, fruit salad bowl, bread and roll station, soup, hot beverages, iced tea)

The following may be added to the Full Hot and Cold Buffets as well as Deli and Salad Buffets:

Soup	\$ .75
Desserts	\$ .45, 1.25, 1.45
Sodas	\$ .75
Juice, Milk	\$ .75
Bottled Beverages	\$ 1.25




Relationship Week is beginning to take form and I wanted to inform you of the dates and some of what you can expect to see in the schedule. The theme week is scheduled to occur from Monday, September 28 through Friday, October 2, 1992.


Our keynote speaker for the week is Richard Keeling, M.D. Dr. Keeling is the Director of the Department of Student Health and Associate Professor of Internal Medicine (Hematology/Oncology) at the University of Virginia. He is the founding chairperson for the American College Health Association's Task Force on HIV Disease, and is a past president of that Association. Dr. Keeling is President of the International Society for AIDS Education, President of the Foundation for Health in Higher Education, Executive Editor of the Journal of American College Health, and Senior Consultant for Health Advocates. He will be presenting two programs on Tuesday, September 29th. His 12:30 p.m. address will be for the total campus community, and at 2:30 p.m. he will speak specifically to faculty members and administrators. This is being funded by the Concert and Lecture Series. (Feel free to invite colleagues from other campuses to join us at 2:30 p.m.)

We hope to have YO-ACAP (Youth Outreach - Adolescent Community AIDS Program) joining us. YO-ACAP is a group of high school students who use rap songs to communicate their messages to their listeners. Their ties to La Salle began last year when our students raised money through a program on safer sex, and gave the proceeds to YO-ACAP.

Other programs include acquaintance rape, diversity in relationships, and conflict resolution. Students will facilitate programs about alcohol and relationships, intimacy without intercourse, and a variety of "lighter" activities. In addition, a number of informal small group discussions are being planned to look at family relationships, dating, student/faculty relationships, communicating, and dealing with loss.
