RE: APPLICATIONS TO DIRECT 1993 SUMMER SEMINARS FOR
SCHOOL TEACHERS.

The National Endowment for the Humanities has announced the opening of the application period for directing 1993 Summer Seminars for School Teachers.

Proposals to direct summer seminars are encouraged from those with demonstrated excellence in teaching who are also active scholars in their fields. Prospective seminar directors will have wide latitude to design their seminars, but they must observe two essential guidelines:

- (1). that each seminar focus on a limited number of major works in the humanities; and
- (2). that the works chosen be studied intensively and in their own right - not simply as relevant to the development of a particular theme or idea.

The application deadline is April 1, 1992.

An information booklet on the program is available for review in the Provost's Office.

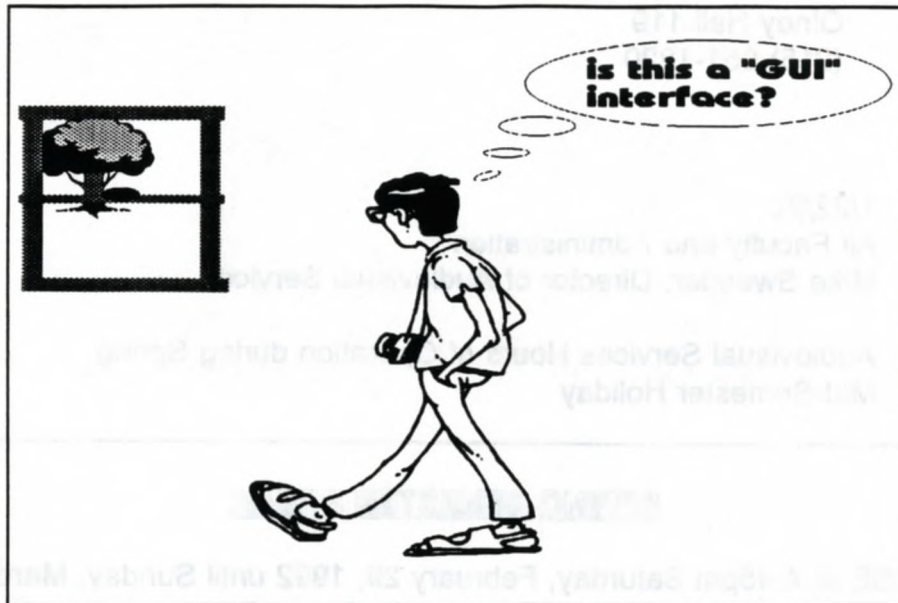
