SUMMER WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

June 30 - July 1, 1992

I. REPORTS

Council received reports on enrollment for 1992, housing for 1992, the "Gold Card" debit card system, the prospective Capital Campaign, the 1991-92 budget, the searches for a new Library Director and a new Provost, and the progress of the proposal for the Institute for the Advancement of Mathematics and Science Education.

II. STRATEGIC PLANNING

Council supported the idea of a more consistent and formal planning process. The President will review suggestions from the discussion and return the topic to Council for additional review and possibly the creation of an ad hoc body to work on implementation.

III. PROPOSAL FOR A FOOTBALL PROGRAM

After extensive discussion, action on this proposal was tabled pending outcomes of a survey of top feeder schools by the Enrollment Services Area and of a pledge solicitation by the Student Affairs Area.

IV. EVALUATION OF ADMINISTRATORS

The Faculty Senate President reintroduced this topic from last year's Workshop. Pros and cons remained essentially unchanged from previous discussions. The President concluded that the subject be on the agenda for a Fall semester meeting with a possible additional review by the Faculty Senate.

V. HEALTH CARE ISSUES

The President of the Faculty Senate presented a question about faculty members covered by a spouse's health

insurance receiving a partial cash return of the University's contribution to health insurance premiums if they do not enroll. The Vice President for Business Affairs reported that a review of the suggestion indicated that implementation would require a significant increase in the University's health care budget rather than producing a savings for the University. Another Council member observed that benefit programs are separate from the salary portion of compensation and expressed concern about a precedent for converting them to cash.

On other matters, the Vice President for Business Affairs reported that although Pru-Care costs have increased, the increase has not been as great as it would have been with the "Blues," and Pru-Care will be offering a full "HMO" option in the near future. He also reported a new accounting requirement on post-retirement benefits which may pose some significant budget planning difficulties in the future.

VI. TENURE AND PROMOTION APPEALS PROCESS

The Deans and the Faculty Senate with the leadership of the Provost will prepare a proposal on a new process for appeal of recommendations of the Tenure and Promotion Committee to be submitted to the Board of Trustees by no later than the Board's meeting in the Fall of 1993.
