The University has recently signed a transfer agreement with Thomas Jefferson's College of Allied Health Sciences.

The College of Allied Health is an upper-division institution which accepts only transfer students who have completed two full years of college work. Programs which they offer which may be of interest to potential students here include a number of programs in Laboratory Sciences, Occupational Therapy, Radiography, and Physical Therapy. With the exception of Physical Therapy, which is a three year program leading to a master's degree, the majors there lead to the baccalaureate degree. Although Jefferson also has an upper division nursing program in the College of Allied Health, we will not be promoting that program as part of this agreement.

La Salle thus joins a number of other schools -- Villanova, and Allegheny College, for example -- which have signed such agreements with Jefferson.

Under the agreement, students must meet La Salle's standard admissions criteria. They must then complete their first two years of study here before applying to transfer to Jefferson. Brother Thomas McPhillips of the Biology Department has agreed to serve as faculty advisor for students enrolled in these programs.

As you probably know, the University has opened a search for a permanent appointment to the position of Director of Library Services. Advertisements of the search will appear in April in issues of The Chronicle of Higher Education and College & Research Libraries News. The following paragraph from the ad outlines the qualifications sought in candidates:

Applicants must possess a Master's degree from an ALA-accredited program. An additional graduate degree is preferred. Applicants should have a record of five years of progressively responsible staff and administrative experience in academic libraries. Selection will also be based on evidence of excellent communications skills; a strong service orientation; ability to work effectively with staff, faculty, students, administration, alumni, and other relevant constituencies; knowledge of library technology, including familiarity with developments and trends as well as practical experience with library automation; and active contributions to the profession through publications or leadership in professional organizations.

If you know of qualified persons who might be interested in the position, we would appreciate your bringing the search to their attention. They may write or telephone me (951-1065) for a copy of the full text of the advertisement or to discuss the position and the search process. The search committee will begin review of applications on May 1, 1992.

EILEEN IS A MEMBER OF THE CLASS OF 1992 MAJORING IN ENGLISH AND GERMAN.

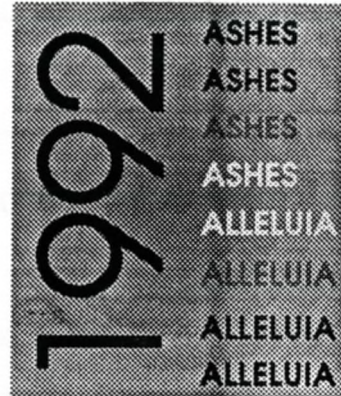
TRUMAN SCHOLAR

Dear Colleague,

Roosevelt Middle School on Washington Lane has reopened and its library suffers from a dearth of books and other educational resources. Ms. Marjorie Elliot, a member of the staff of Roosevelt School and of the board of our Urban Center, asked whether we at La Salle could help to restock their almost empty shelves.

The Inter-Fraternity/Sorority Council and Evening Student Council ~~has~~ begun a drive to collect books for Roosevelt. We have a list of books from the librarian there which would help their students. Their librarian will also be glad to accept other books, used or new, that might interest children from fifth through eighth grade. Some children will be advanced readers who will benefit from books at a higher reading level; others may enjoy books somewhat below fourth grade.

Our faculty and staff are asked to join with the students in gathering books. If you can help, please bring paperback or hardback books in good physical condition to the Urban Center, to the office of the School of Continuing Studies (evening school) or to Campus Ministry by April 12. This money can be given at the Urban Center, Campus Ministry or at the table IFSC plans to have in College Union from April 6 to April 10.

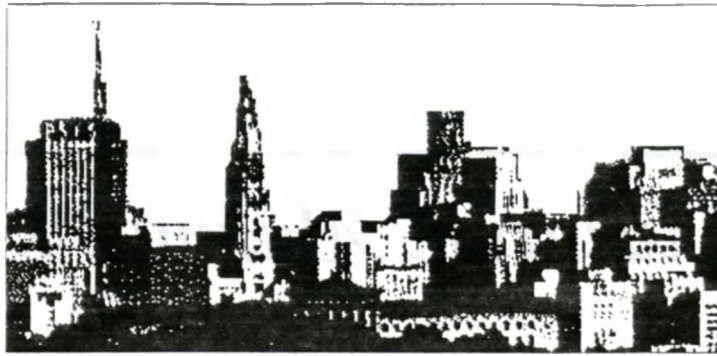
Our buying new children's books individually for Roosevelt might result in duplication, five Brian's Song's, or ten Stride Toward Freedom's. Instead of, or in addition to, bringing in one or more used books you might one or two dollars (or a little less or a little more) toward the purchase of new books for the library.

Books that help the children affirm their gender or racial identity might be especially helpful. If you can give games children can play in the library during the lunch or after-school periods or videotapes the teachers can use, these will be welcome.

This book drive won't save the world. It will respond to a request made by a neighbor who is a member of our Urban Center board. It is a way our students, staff and faculty can help young people in the neighborhood in the important business of their education.
