Re: New Administrative Telephone Switch

As many of you are aware, the telephone switch that serves the faculty and administrative offices will be replaced this summer. As a cost containment measure, we will be replacing the 20 year old GTE technology and consolidating trunk lines between the University and The Bell Telephone Company.

A great deal of preliminary work is in progress to minimize the service interruption associated with such an endeavor. However, there will be a point when the switch will have to be disconnected so the new switch can be put into service. The actual shutdown of the current switch is scheduled to take place shortly after the close of the business day, Friday July 30 at 3:30 p.m. The new, expanded switch will be brought on line shortly thereafter. Immediately following the switch start-up, we will begin the process of replacing selected telephone sets. These include all digital phones, Toshiba phones, 1A2 key system phones, and the Tie 24/64 system in the Library.

For the most part, outgoing phone service will be available to those with standard analog single line telephone sets within 30 minutes after cut-over. We are relying on our good friends at Bell of Pennsylvania to redirect incoming phone calls via the new trunk lines in an efficient and timely manner. This will be a gradual process which will take a minimum of three hours.

We are in the process of notifying everyone requiring telephone replacement. For those who will be getting new phones, a number of training sessions will be held the last week of July just prior to cut-over. They will be conducted by Bell South with the exact times and location to be announced shortly. I realize that this is short notice, and may be difficult to fit into summer schedules. However, the significant annual savings associated with this endeavor require it to move forward as quickly as possible.

For those unable to attend these sessions, a user manual will accompany each new phone. Additional training and support will also be available after cut-over as needed.

Our plan is for all service to be completely restored by Monday morning, and to have technicians available to respond immediately to any difficulties.

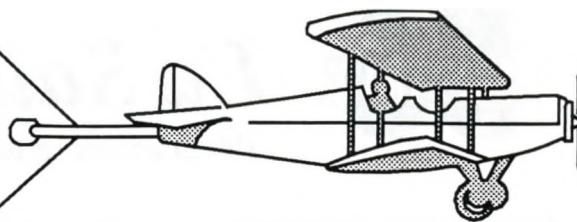
