SUBJECT: Update on Taxability of Graduate Tuition Remission Benefit

In January you were informed that the Payroll Office would hold off taxing graduate tuition remission benefits pending the outcome of legislation to re-instate the tax free status of the benefit retroactive to July 1, 1992.

On August 10, 1993, President Clinton signed into law the 1993 Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act. Under this Act, the tax free status of our graduate tuition remission benefit has been reinstated retroactive to July 1, 1992 and extends through June 30, 1994.
