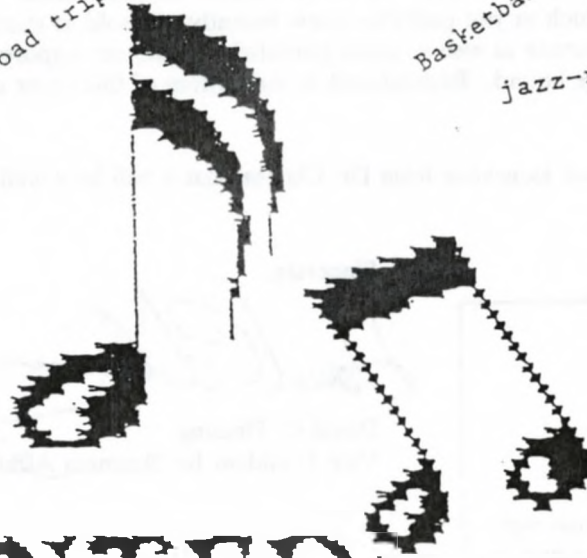

For your information you should know that we have agreed to lease to the School District of Philadelphia the south campus classroom building for the 1992-93 school year. They will be using it for a special program called "The Parkway Program". There should be between 200 and 250 students plus 14 faculty. It is a net lease under which they have complete responsibility for the building - janitorial, repairs, maintenance, etc..

We are assisting the School District with what became an acute need. This program had be housed at Spring Garden College which as you probably know recently was sold at sheriff sale. We view this as a chance to do a community service as well as some potential recruitment opportunities. The students in this program are generally college bound. ■ THE PARKWAY PROGRAM

The Parkway Program is a four year high-school-with-out-walls with a voluntarily integrated student body from all sections of the city. Parkway provides a strong basic-subject curriculum supplemented by over 150 community-based learning opportunities and strong ties with area colleges and universities. Community-based opportunities include studies at historic, art and scientific institutions and volunteer work in medical, social and educational agencies. College courses as well as special experiences in research are available for juniors and seniors at the University of Pennsylvania, Temple University, Lincoln University, Spring Garden College and Philadelphia Community College. A supportive Parkway staff offers a wide range of classes at locations throughout the city. With faculty and parental guidance, students help design their programs, based on graduation requirements, ability levels and special interests. Placement of graduates in colleges and employment is outstanding.

The Academic Discovery Program (ADP) has an opening for the full-time position of Coordinator of Tutorial Services. The Coordinator is responsible for the academic progress of ADP students and assists the Director in the supervision of the program. In addition to hiring, training, and supervising student and professional tutors, the Coordinator assigns tutors to ADP students who need supplemental academic support. As academic advisor to approximately fifty ADP students, the Coordinator must guide these students in the appropriate selection of courses and majors. Other duties include some tutoring of students, teaching a course in the summer program, evaluating the various components of the ADP, compiling data on student performance, and organizing student workshops. Applicants should hold a Masters Degree in a field related to remedial education or have at least five years' experience working with developmental students.
