The minutes of the October 15th meeting were approved as written.

The appropriate Graduate Directors will notify the students of their selection to these committees.

The Graduate Directors recommended that the Council of Graduate Directors continue. They recommended that the Council liaison have a one course release time and secretarial support. Dr. Kane suggested the relationships among the Deans, Chairs, Graduate Directors, and the Provost be documented in order to clarify these relations. The Council of Graduate Directors feel that the council is evolving. Responsibilities include those of an administrative nature plus some responsibilities involving the view book and graduate catalogue.

The Graduate Directors will develop:

- . Job Description of the Liaison
- . Tasks of various committees
- . Organizational chart.

Processes and procedures for curriculum development, evaluation, administrative tasks, and marketing issues need to be addressed.

John Keenan suggested organizational charts and flow charts that will articulate the process to PED in a coherent manner.

Recommendation: The Council of Graduate Directors will develop a plan prior to the next meeting.

Admission and advisement of foreign students was discussed. Dr. Brownstein presented information concerning TOFEL

scores. All foreign students must also take placement exams given by LSU. Ms. Mshomba suggested that the students achieve a score of 55 on the TOFEL. TOFEL scores, as other standardized tests, do not always reflect the students true ability and the Directors would like to have some flexibility. Dr. Brownstein will communicate the Graduate Directors concerns to Ms. Mshomba and report back to Graduate Council at the next meeting.
