Dear Faculty/Administrators,

I am writing to you concerning the annual **Project Appalachia** program. For over fifteen years Project Appalachia has been serving the needs of the poor in the Appalachian region. As a result of this program, many of those in need have received much needed home and community repairs. Families have had leaky roofs repaired, windows fixed, kitchen floors repaired, porches built and rebuilt, as well as community work on schools, community centers and so forth. In addition, the program has provided a valuable learning experience for the student volunteers and has furthered the cause of social justice to which this university is committed. The program is well recognized throughout the university as a valuable spring break alternative and a truly effective community service program.

This year we are traveling to Philippi in Barber County, West Virginia where we will be working with the Heart-in-Hand Mission Project. We are scheduled to work on several projects including: the building of a community center, floor repairs on a woman's trailer, fixing the roof and wall for a single mother living in a trailer, putting up a fence for the mission thrift shop, etc. In addition, I've just received some bad news from the mission. They've had a terrible flood in the area and some of the homes around the mission were under five feet of water. So as you can see, we have our work cut out for us. While the region is virtually devoid of industry and expects little help in the form of government aid, the volunteers from schools such as La Salle provide a hope for these people and relief from the poverty which has gripped their home.

The van rental and cost of the building materials (drywall, wood, paint, etc.) has shot the cost of the trip to over ten thousand dollars, or around two hundred dollars per volunteer. Each of the La Sallian volunteers has agreed to put up \$120.00 each for the trip (\$60 of their own money and \$60 worth of sponsorships). This leaves a deficit of \$80 per student to be attained through extensive fundraising efforts.

On behalf of your previous support for the program, the volunteers of Project Appalachia deeply thank you. But the volunteers of Project Appalachia once again need your help to keep this program alive. Please consider a donation to this most valuable student program and spread the word about its needs and benefits. Any contribution will be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your help and support.

Midterm Grade Reports for First-Year Students

Because of snow delays in the Spring calendar, the deadline for all midterm grade reports, both in the Registrar's Office and in the Office of the Dean of Arts and Sciences, has been changed to **March 14**.

The Dean's Office will continue implementing the new system for monitoring the progress of first-year students, which requires faculty to report only on those students. **All faculty who have first-year students in their classes should do two things:**

a. Identify those first-year students who are performing below the level of "C" work, beginning with C-, and fill out one descriptive form for each. These forms should be returned to the Dean of Arts and Sciences no later than March 14. Instructors should be sure to discuss this assessment with the students.

b. Fill out the grade sheets (that will list only first-year students in each course) and return them to either the Registrar or the Dean's Office, so that the students' report cards can be processed.

Follow-up advisement for the students performing below par will be addressed through the major departments and, for "undecided" students, through their Fall FYE teachers/advisors. The Department Chairs and the FYE faculty will be asked to monitor this counseling which should coincide with the pre-registration period.

For this process to be effective, it is essential that the reports be returned by the deadline, otherwise this information cannot be routed in good time.

Although the recent storms have helped to reduce the work-study payroll to some extent, we continue to find constraints necessary. As a result, we ask that students not be permitted to work during the spring break (March 7 - 11). Your compliance with this request is very much appreciated. Without your help, I'm afraid that more drastic cutbacks will be necessary.

Additionally, it is important that all work-study supervisors remember that student schedules should be adjusted so students are working **no more than 15 hours per week**. Adjusting student schedules and monitoring the number of hours worked is your duty as a supervisor. We will not approve time sheets which contain more than 15 hours for an individual student. If you need to have a student work more than 15 hours, please pay those additional hours through your own budget.
