SUBJECT: Important Information Regarding Fiscal Year End

As we approach the end of the fiscal year, we need your special cooperation in order to help ensure that the fiscal activity of your department budget is recorded in the correct fiscal year. This will require coordination between yourself and others in your department who are authorized to initiate charges to the budget, and the offices responsible for processing these transactions - i.e. Bursar's Office, Accounts Payable, Campus Store, etc. The chart below indicates the various deadlines with respect to recording charges (transactions) against the 1993-94 budgets.

Please review this list and make appropriate note. Transactions received after the indicated deadline will have to be charged to the 1994-95 budget. Your special attention is called to the payment of vendors by approved invoices. Only those accounts payable supported by 1993-94 outstanding Purchase Orders will be chargeable to the 1993-94 budget after the indicated June 22, 1994 deadline.

The imminent departure of Brother Michael McGinniss to assume the presidency of Christian Brothers University will leave the position of Vice President of the Corporation vacant. In keeping with the by-laws of the University, in May the Board of Trustees was involved in the selection of a successor to Brother McGinniss. I am pleased to tell you that the Board has chosen Brother Edward Sheehy to fill the position of Vice President of the Corporation, effective July 1, 1994.

Edward J. Sheehy, F.S.C., Ph.D. is Associate Professor of History. He holds degrees from La Salle, Johns Hopkins, and George Washington universities, is widely published in his field, and received the Lindback Award for Distinguished Teaching in 1991. In addition to numerous committee assignments, Ed has been on the Faculty Senate since 1992. Prior to his appointment at La Salle University, Ed had extensive administration experience at the secondary level, and was a member of our Board of Trustees from 1985-1988.

For your information, the La Salle University Handbook describes the position of Vice President of the Corporation as follows:

The Vice President of the [Corporation] shall be a Brother of the Christian Schools. He shall be elected for a term of five years by a vote of at least two-thirds of the members of the Board present and voting from candidates presented by the Committee on Nominations. He shall assist the President of the University and shall, in the absence, death, or disability of the President, perform the duties of that office. He shall sit with the Board and with the Executive Committee of the Board. (p. 12)

Please join me in congratulating Brother Edward Sheehy on this important appointment by the Board.

SERVING TIME ON CAMPUS

Kingston, R.I. - A convicted drug dealer is doing time at the U. of R.I. instead of in a prison.



Since Jan., Juan C. Taveras, a freshman, has been serving a home-confinement sentence by living in a URI dorm and wearing an electronic ankle device that allows a state agency to keep track of him.

A superior court judge in Jan. sentenced Mr. T. to 10 years in prison for selling drugs - a charge to which he had pleaded not guilty. The judge suspended 90 months of the sentence and required that 30 months be served at the URI where Mr. T. had enrolled after his 1993 arrest.

URI officials, who learned of the case in Feb., believe it is the first of its kind at a college. A spokeswoman called Mr. T a "model student," and added: "If it had been a violent crime, he would not be here."

NEW SITE FOR AOD INFO

A repository for alcohol and other drug information has been established in the Administrative Computing's Local Access Network. This information is easily accessible by any student, staff, or faculty with access to the Administrative LAN.

To review these files, log onto WordPerfect (enter 'W,W' on the LAN menu). Once into WP, enter 'F5, N:'. This is the public access directory for the campus. Scroll down to 'Alcohol' or 'Drugs' and enter twice ('enter,enter'). Review the files regularly as new additions will be added frequently. These are

public access files for your personal use. If these are used in any information for students, please cite the AOD Program (Counseling Ctr., X-1355).

INTERNET GOPHERS

There are an apparently infinite (alright, whole bunch) of gophers available on the Internet which address every conceivable (OK, OK, many) academic topics. For those who are not familiar with Gophers, these are repositories of files, information, resources, and in some cases, software (IBM & Mac), available to those who have access to Internet and enable the user to download this information for personal use.
