Discussion:

1. The minutes of the March 15, 1994 meeting were reviewed. The motion to accept the minutes was made, seconded, and approved by the Committee members present (9-0-0).
2. The Hierarchy evaluation form was distributed. Weights were determined for each of the criteria following discussion. Mr. Mullen agreed to provide pertinent information to the committee on "competitiveness" (Can we or do we field a competitive team?).
3. The Chair outlined the initial efforts of the Gender Equity subcommittee. A tour and review of the Hayman Hall facility has been completed, and a review of all other facilities is scheduled.
4. Dr. O'Connor introduced several student/athletes for interviews. (NOTE: Student/Athlete names have been deleted)

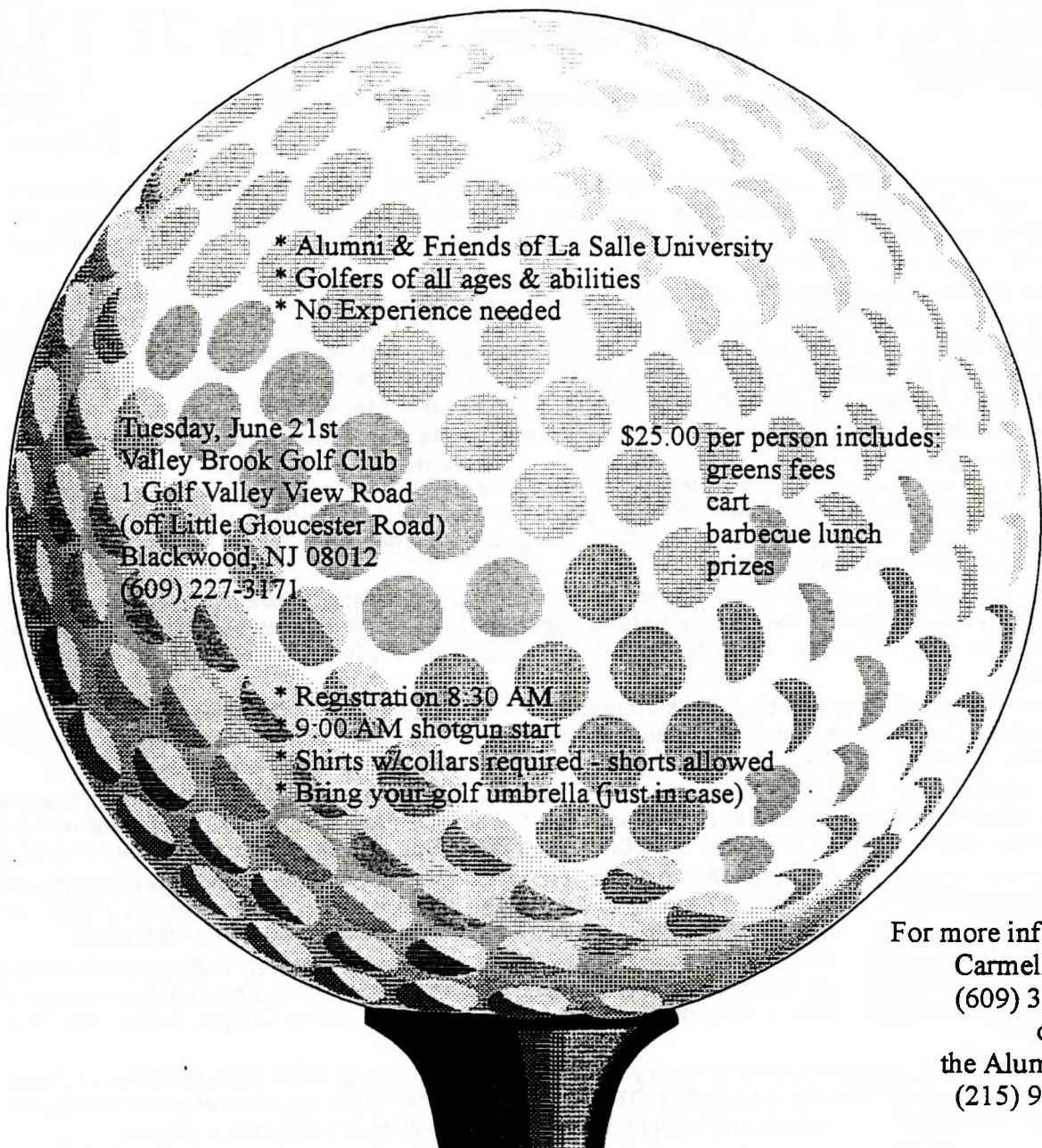
