***REMINDER: OPEN FORUM ON DRAFT GUIDELINES FOR REVISED PROGRAMMING PROCESS***

*The Forum will be held on Tuesday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, at 12:30 p.m. in Olney Hall, Room 109. All members of the La Salle community are invited to discuss the guidelines with members of the Concert and Lecture Series Committee.*

For your information, I have appended some highlights of our statements. Copies of the complete draft statements will be available at the forum on January 24th. If you would like to have the complete document before that meeting, please let know, and I will send you a copy.

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## HIGHLIGHTS OF PROGRAMMING GUIDELINES

The purpose of the process is to encourage imaginative programming which enhances the educational, intellectual, and cultural life of the University. Each academic year, four academic departments will be eligible to sponsor a program and two programs will be open for competitive applications to sponsor a program. Two department sponsored programs and one competitive slot will be scheduled in each of the regular semesters of the academic year. The department sponsor list for each year will be determined by selection of one department from each of the following groups:

Group A - Biology; Chemistry/Biochemistry; Geology/Physics;  
Mathematics/Computer Science; Nursing; Psychology;

Group B - Communication; English; Fine Arts; Foreign  
Languages; History;

Group C - Education; Philosophy; Political Science; Religion;  
Sociology, Social Work, and Criminal Justice;

Group D - Accounting; Economics; Finance; Management;  
Marketing.

Activities proposed must provide educational, intellectual, or cultural contributions to the life of the University and be related to the University's mission. Activities that are primarily recreational or entertainment in content will not receive funding. Activities need not be confined to the discipline(s) of a sponsoring academic department, and they do not have to be limited to the specific area of activity of non-academic sponsors. Eligible sponsors may combine their proposals into one package, and this package may include applicants for one of the competitive slots available each semester.

A committee will evaluate program proposals on the basis of their fulfillment of announced guidelines and goals. The committee may approve proposals as submitted, approve a proposal with suggested revisions, defer approval pending revisions, or reject a proposal. The committee will have three faculty members, three students, one Student Affairs Administrator, one Academic Affairs administrator, and the Assistant Provost for Administration as *ex officio* chair. Administrative responsibility for the programming process will reside in the Provost's Office and, more specifically, with the Assistant Provost for Administration.

The program review committee will also oversee use of a supplementary budget to provide programming variety and to take advantage of opportunities arising outside the regular planning schedule. The chair of the committee will oversee use of a supplementary budget to assist in funding smaller scale programs or programs for classes or departments in the academic area.
