Because each department of the University must assess its budget, and Duplicating Services is no different, you will notice with this issue of Campus News, the look has changed. One of the ways that we can save on our costs is to switch to an all black ink on white paper format completed on our high speed copiers.

The Duplicating Department is committed
to help save the University dollars.

As many steps as possible are being taken to reduce our internal costs. In fact, we have always looked for the least expensive way to proceed with the production of your duplicating requests. As a result of those previous efforts, for those of you who may not know, our price list has not changed since 1984. The price per copy includes your choice of white or colored stock in 11 and 14 inch sizes, 11 inch three hole drilled paper, with or without stapling in collated sets.

You can help us to maintain our current
price list by ordering two sided copies
on white paper for your duplicating work orders.

Also, as we prepare to begin a new year and a new semester, I want to inform you that requests for 14" paper have become so rare that we cannot justify purchasing cartons of various colors to hold in inventory. We will continue to carry white only in 14" stock for those who need it. The same situation exists for three-hole drilled paper. Please expect white only to be available at all times in 14" and three hole drilled stocks.

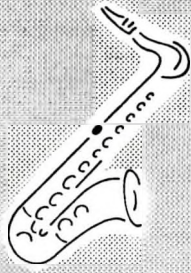

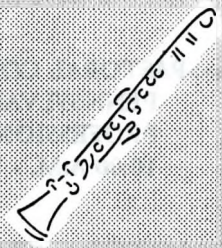
