I wanted to extend congratulations and thank yous to everyone who helped make the Career Expo such a tremendous success - students, faculty and of course the staff and student workers of Career Planning.

Employers throughout the day and on their evaluation forms consistently commented on the professionalism, enthusiasm, and preparedness of the students. To quote a few:

Dr. Kane called the meeting to order at 2:34 p.m.

Revisions in Social Work Curriculum

Dr. Sybil Montgomery presented a revised social work curriculum for the committee's approval. The request follows a three year self-study and reflects new accrediting agency requirements. The revisions include: (1) reorganizing the Human Behavior in the Social Environment content, by adding SWK 280: Human Behavior in the Social Environment and requiring SOC 262: Dynamics of Ethnic Diversity; (2) redistributing existing content in the social work practice sequence to more adequately reflect CSWE requirements; (3) redistributing field instruction credits; (4) establishing SWK 240: Relationships and Sexuality as a social work elective; and (5) redistributing elective courses within the major. These changes reflect the current accrediting emphasis that seeks to tie course content specifically to field experience and practice. The current trend in social work is integration of everything into a single orchestrated curriculum.

A conversation on the broad curriculum concerns and questions specific to the new courses ensued. Committee members questioned whether several areas of inquiry--for example, psychological development, poverty issues, basic economics--will be covered adequately in the revised curriculum. Some committee members were concerned about the narrowing of courses outside the major and the tendency to force the core to serve the major. There was some discussion about what "ethnicity" means, how broadly "sexuality" is conceived, and the ideological framework for "social work". Montgomery indicated that decisions about how material is covered are now virtually dictated by the CSWE requirements. Members questioned to what extent night students receive the same quality as day students.

Sybil Montgomery and Finn Hornum were excused with gratitude. The procedural question was raised whether such dismissal of the presenters is conducive to open communication. A further procedural question inquired whether, when curriculum changes are driven by demands of exterior accrediting agencies, information about such accrediting requirements be included in the proposal.

When discussion was completed, the committee, in separate votes, approved the addition of SWK 280 as a required course; the addition of SWK 240 as an elective; and the necessary curricular changes as outlined in the social work program proposal.

Program Review Process

B. Millard presented her revision of the Program Review Process. Its focus is on issues of quality, rather than accountability. The previous outline has been simplified. Additions include inquiry into the integration of courses, the effectivity of advisement and a review of resources. Committee members are asked to study this document for further discussion.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:55 p.m.

Please be advised that due to the recent downsizing efforts made throughout the university and in particular, the Registrar's Office, we must make changes in the way our Office completes certain activities.

Our goal is to utilize our staff and resources as efficiently as possible. And while it is likely that the average time to provide information requested by various individuals and offices will increase somewhat, we will make every effort to respond as quickly as possible.

To help us meet your information needs as efficiently as possible while continuing the Office's normal information processing activities, I would ask that all members of the campus community adhere to the following procedures when requesting information, labels, etc... from the Registrar's Office:

- 1) All requests must be made in writing. This includes: label requests, transcript requests, room reservations, etc... There will be no exceptions!
- 2) All requests should be clear and concise. If they are vague or misleading, they may take considerably longer to be processed.
- 3) All requests will be processed in the order that they are received. Please keep in mind that we receive several requests a day; each request taking anywhere from a short while to several days to complete.
- 4) Finally, we are very aware of those situations which arise at the last minute and for whatever reason, information needs to be collected rather quickly. In those cases, I would ask that those individuals speak to me directly. I will try to cooperate accordingly but cannot guarantee that all requests will be honored immediately.

I thank you for your continued cooperation as we strive to meet your needs.

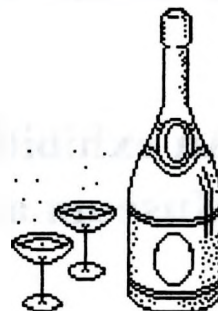

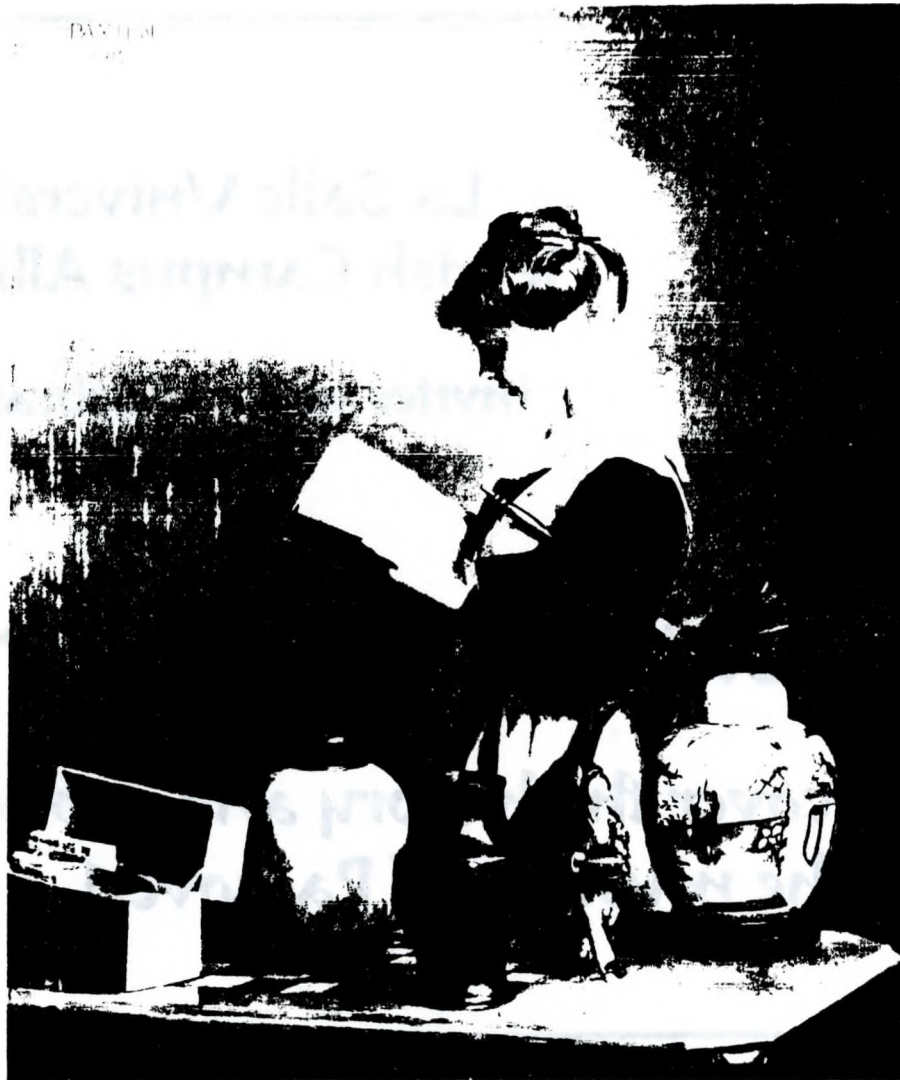
