RE: Invitation to Meet the Committee

The La Salle University Board of Trustees has appointed an *ad hoc* committee to evaluate the performance of Brother Joseph F. Burke as President and to make a recommendation to the Board concerning the next presidential term (1997-2002).

The committee has invited representatives of the administration, faculty, staff, students, and alumni to meet with us to share their views on key issues the University needs to address during the next presidential term and to give us an assessment of Brother Joseph's tenure as president and his ability to meet the needs of the University in the next term.

The committee will be available in the Board Room on the second floor of the Union Building on Saturday morning, **April 20, 1996**, to meet with other members of the La Salle University community who may wish to speak to us about these issues. We invite interested individuals or groups to contact **Gerald Johnson, Assistant Provost (extension 1065)** to arrange an appointment. Your request for an appointment should be made no later than *12:00 Noon* on Friday, *April 12*.

We will be grateful for your contribution to our effort to get a good sense of the University Community on this important matter.

A follow-up session on the City As Classroom program has been scheduled for Tuesday, April 16, at 2:30 p.m., in the Lawrence Conference Room, on the fourth floor of the Administration Center.

We suggest as the agenda the development of guidelines for assessing applications for funding of activities. The Council of Deans has been evaluating applications on a somewhat ad hoc basis. After the last round of reviews, the Deans expressed strong interest in developing guidelines for their review and to assist potential applicants in submitting proposals. The Deans also urged development of those guidelines based on faculty recommendations. The guidelines might, for example, address the questions of whether students should be expected to bear some of the cost of an activity, whether undergraduate classes should be given priority over graduate classes, whether activities in the Greater Philadelphia region should have priority over activities outside the area, and so on.

Although we recommend guideline development as the primary agenda item, other topics can, of course, be discussed, and we welcome any contributions to the discussion.

"Science is my favorite class..."
The development and Implementation of IMS 150

Join Dave Smith, Bert Strieb, Nancy Jones, Tom McPhillips, and education majors for a discussion of IMS 150, a new interdisciplinary course offered under the auspices of the IAMST. In addition to being interdisciplinary, this course was conducted using active learning strategies and collaborative learning methods. Discussion will focus on the planning and implementation of this course, especially in light of student needs and the challenges of interdisciplinary team teaching. Students will describe their experiences in the course, and their evaluation of the approach used to teach them core ideas in science. Video clips will show some of the learning activities used by the teachers.

This roundtable is NOT for science faculty ONLY! Any faculty member interested in active learning strategies and interdisciplinary teaching will find this session informative. So come and join us. Bring a bag lunch. Coffee, soda, and pretzels are provided.

Fostering Active Learning: Asking Good Questions

Research has shown that, in the typical classroom, many faculty questions go unanswered and a very high percentage of student responses come from a very small percentage of students. Further, research suggests that the way in which questions are framed influences the level and type of student thinking which results. This workshop, led by Bob Vogel, will help faculty to design questions that will involve more students in class discussion *and* in higher-level thinking. A set of handouts on questioning in the classroom will be distributed to each attendee.

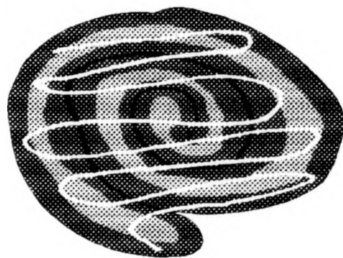

When completing the form, all of your choices should be indicated in the areas provided for each particular detail that you require. Use the comment area only for those details that are not listed anywhere else on the form.

Many of our customers choose to indicate no preferences for paper, etc. for their duplicating work orders because they are not particular about the details. The Duplicating Department finds this to be an acceptable practice and we will reproduce any work order submitted in this way on white paper, two sided, collated & stapled.
