Dear Members of the Campus Community:

This letter serves as an update to the many discussions about a campus pub which have occurred over the past three years. It is also a response to the Middle States task force recommendation which states, "Create a campus pub that serves alcoholic beverages to students and others of legal drinking age."

Extensive legal review and cost analysis was completed by a committee sympathetic to the social needs created by our residential location. The review led to the decision that the pub is not financially feasible at this time. Our current "club" license for alcohol has many restrictions associated with it. It is not a license equivalent to that of a bar or restaurant. In the past the University chose to use its license as a "catering" license rather than taking on the additional costs associated with running a club. As we explored the regulations and costs, a decision was made to proceed no further with this project. I will not go into the specifics here but if you would like to discuss the issue further, I am willing to share the information which has been compiled over the past year.

Again quoting the Student Life Task Force report (ACT Survey results), "To improve on-campus activities, 78% agreed that a campus pub would improve student social life; 75% agreed that an evening coffee bar would have the same effect..." The University has moved on the recommendation for an evening coffee bar and the project has been successful as evidenced by the review in The Collegian last fall.

If you have not taken the time to visit the coffee bar, I would encourage you to do so. If you have questions or comments on these or other issues relating to the campus life of our students, feel free to contact me.

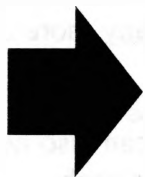
