Chile Service Project - Amistades Sin Fronteras

Over the Winter Break, six students and two administrators traveled to Santiago, Chile to participate in the Chile Service Project (CSP). This is the second year for this project, and there is already a long list of possible participants for next year. The theme of the CSP is *Amistades Sin Fronteras - Friendship without Borders*.

While in Chile the group helped organize a summer day camp for children in the poor shantytown La Pincoya in Santiago. The group work with Chilean youth in organizing the camp. Participants played games, taught and learned songs, told stories and did arts and crafts.

The theme for the day camp was: "The Rights of the Child," and the group worked with the themes which are elaborated in the *United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Children*. Participants broke into group to talk about such issues as friendship, peace, and solidarity, and then did arts and crafts related to these themes, such as drawings, paintings, and chalking the streets. The camp ended with all participants painting a mural together.

Aside from the camp, La Salle participants spent a week with families, living in their homes and sharing with them. They also visited a number of organizations where they learned of human rights, women, the educational system, economics, and other issues. And, the group visited the cemetery where there is a monument to the detained and disappeared and those executed by the dictatorship, as well as visiting a base christian community.

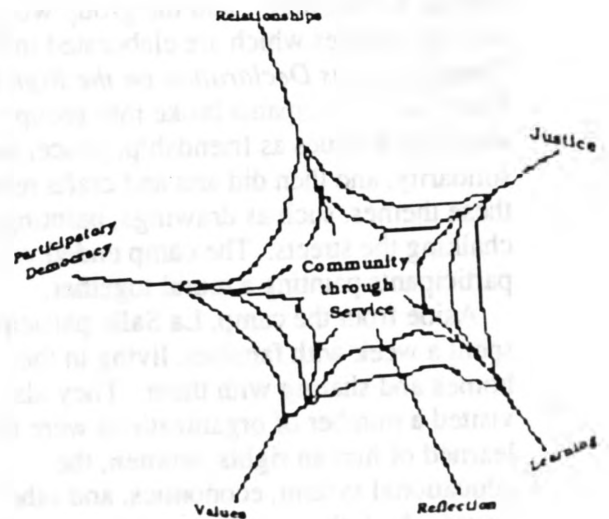

Fall Community-Learning Experiences

During the Fall, 1995 semester, hundreds of La Salle students were involved in community-learning activities, both curricularly and co-curricularly. These experiences were formative for many, profound for others, fun, educational and challenging. Below are some comments from some La Salle students regarding these activities:

- "Working with a 16 year old girl with autistic tendencies and watching her get excited over reading a book or doing something fun that is also educational was a success for me."
- "My student is having problems with math (addition and subtraction) and we have been using flashcards and doing problems on the board. Although we have only been together twice, she is already improving."
- "My experience volunteering has been a very positive one. It is wonderful to still believe in and see that there are actually good people in this world. All day, everyday, the only thing you see on the news is all the negatives of society. Seeing and partaking in the volunteer program renews a sense of hope for the world."
- "This experience of mentoring is one I will never forget. I feel that I have truly given these girls, single teen parents, a more positive outlook on life. They have both promised that regardless of their inability to do what they desire at this time, they are definitely planning to come by and surprise me with the accomplishments they have made in the near future."
- "Successful (community service) programs must provide a tangible service to the community while focusing on individuals' personal needs and an enthusiastic application of the skills and knowledge of the participants involved. I learned that I can apply my own academic advantages while at the same time positively benefiting from new challenges and experiences."

- "Community service was a great experience that helped me to learn about myself by striving for self-accountability regarding human relations."
- "The children I worked with were not bad or dumb; they lacked one thing that most children have and that was parental authority. I am reminded of the saying that a child is not just the responsibility of the parents, but rather of the entire community. That is, 'it takes a village to raise a child.'"
- "I was amazed at how much this experience meant to my students. The learning which took place because they were placed in real situations, looking at real issues which daily affect so many persons, was impressive. I am convinced that profound learning took place because of this experience, and next year plan to make the community-learning component more central to this course."

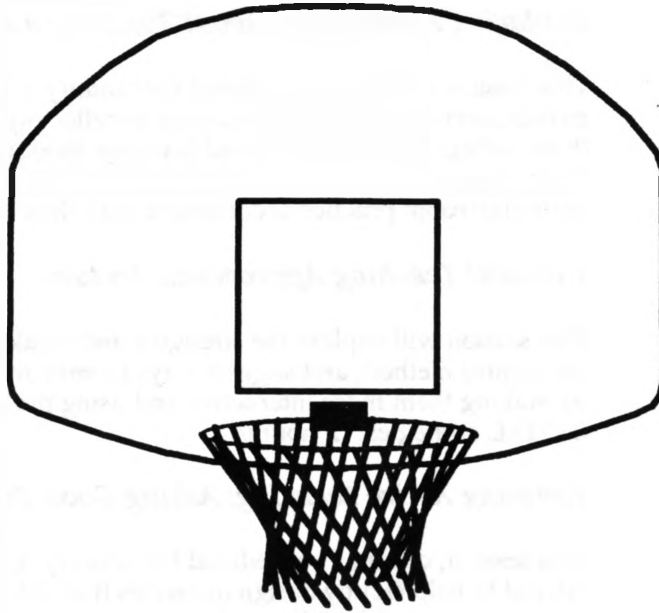


