Student Views on Alcohol and Drinking

While analyzing the comments of La Salle students interviewed for my dissertation on student perspectives on alcohol, drinking, and collegiate life, I noticed that they fell into two distinct categories; those of first- and second-year students (Novice) and third- and fourth-year students (Experienced). What follows is a side-by-side comparison of these perspectives for your information. (conducted between 4/92-4/93)

NOVICE STUDENTS

View alcohol as:

- entry to and enhancement of collegiate social life;
- pre-requisite to having a good time and ensure 'fun' in college;
- a common denominator amongst all students on different campuses;
- necessary and sufficient for collegiate socializing;
- problem 'solver' /reward/ relaxant.

View drinking as:

- 'partying';
- what all college students do;
- consuming until intoxicated;
- the reason for socializing;
- major collegiate recreational activity;
- sign of independence and assertion of personal freedom.

EXPERIENCED STUDENTS

View alcohol as:

- enhancement of collegiate social life;
- way to release inhibitions and permit having 'fun';
- a common denominator amongst many students on different campuses;
- frequently necessary, but not sufficient for collegiate socializing;
- celebration or gregarious activity.

View drinking as:

- part of socializing;
- what many, but not all college students do;
- consumed, occasionally to intoxication;
- a contemporary of collegiate socializing;
- a desired, but not required contemporary of collegiate recreational activity;
- characteristic of adult life.

Connelly's AOD Collection

Connelly Library's Audio Visual Department now has brochures available listing all alcohol and drug abuse videos at the library. There are over 20 videos in the collection dealing with alcoholism, drunk driving, adult children of alcoholics, drug abuse, and recovery issues.

All videos are available to faculty for check out or viewing in the library. Students may view videos in the library by presenting their La Salle ID. Students may also check out videos for classroom presentations with a note from their instructor. The videos have been used in a variety of classes and dorm programs so far.

The two most frequently requested videos in the collection are "Roles: The Script for Children of Alcoholics" and "Alcohol on Campus: Beer, Lies & Videotape."

"Roles" is a presentation by Claudia Black, a worldwide lecturer and trainer in the field of children of alcoholics. Although the 58 minute video consists of Dr. Black lecturing to an audience, her animated and professional presentation style sets this above other "talking heads" videos. Dr. Black presents the four personality roles that ACAs develop to achieve stability in their lives. She elaborates on the emotional problems

caused by taking on these roles of the "responsible," the "adjuster," the "placater" and the "acting out" individual. Also discussed are the ways in which ACAs are "set up" genetically and environmentally for future dependency on alcohol and drugs.

"Alcohol on Campus: Beer Lies & Videotape" is a fast-paced 25 minute video from the University of Maine's Substance Abuse Services. Using real interviews with college students, the video explores the role alcohol plays in their lives, and their social and emotional reasons for drinking. Clips are shown from advertisements and movies that portray drinking as sexy, fun and harmless. Dr. Robert Dana, a substance abuse consultant, and other substance abuse counselors from the University of Maine respond to common student fallacies about drinking (if I build up a tolerance I'll be more in control, people will admire me if I can drink more than they can, I'll stop drinking when I graduate, etc.) The tape doesn't preach, but simply asks students to examine their own drinking behaviors, while presenting information they can use to change those behaviors.
