Dear Colleagues:



SECRETARY'S REPORT

Spring, 1996

Council met seven times over the course of the semester.

In formal actions Council:

1. endorsed the proposed schedule of tuition and fees for 1996-97 for submission to the Board of Trustees;
2. approved inauguration of a Student Activities fee;
3. approved requiring two additional courses for the major in Accounting;
4. endorsed the proposed 1996-97 Budget for submission to the Board of Trustees;
5. approved a Home Pages policy statement;
6. approved a Policy on Research Misconduct in connection with certain federal grant requirements.

Council reviewed suggested revisions in tenure and promotion procedure recommended by the Tenure and Promotion Committee. Action on the recommendations was postponed pending completion of discussion by the Faculty Senate. Some questions were raised about tuition in connection with the change in the Accounting major, but no actions were proposed and further consideration was deferred until additional information was submitted by the relevant constituencies.

During the course of the semester, Council received regular reports on developments in the 1995-96 budget; on recruitment of the Freshman class for September, 1996; and on the work of the Planning and Budgeting Advisory Committee, the Strategic Analysis Task Force; the Faculty Affairs Planning Committee and its *ad hoc* committee; and the President's Cabinet. Council also received information on a plan for revision of the University *Handbook* which called for a draft presentation by the Council's Summer Workshop.

Council's Summer Workshop is scheduled for July 1 and 2, 1996.


