June 17, 1998
Minutes**

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 p.m.

The minutes of the June 4, 1998 meeting were approved as amended. The minutes of the June 9, 1998 meeting were approved as written.

The meeting was spent discussing content and structure of the core.

The committee discussed the feasibility of including some linked-courses in the core. Issues include:

1. Should courses be linked within a semester or across two semesters?
2. Should students be required to take a pair of linked courses, or should linked courses be offered as an option in the core?
3. Should there be a variety of themes linking courses, or should all linked courses tie to a broad, common theme?

The committee also discussed various ways in which our urban location and city resources could be used to enrich the core curriculum.

The meeting adjourned at 2:30 p. m.

Curriculum Design Committee Minutes
June 9th, 1998

Approval of the minutes from the June 4th meeting was postponed.

Because it is clear that financial support for faculty/curriculum development will be an important issue, the committee has been considering the feasibility of soliciting grants from external sources. To that end, Marc Moreau met with several members of the La Salle faculty and staff who have been successful in obtaining grants. Marc reported a variety of ideas about possible funding sources that were suggested at that meeting. The committee decided, however, that pursuing grants would be premature at this time. We need to have a clearer sense of what the core might include before we can target funding sources with a competitive grant.

During this discussion, a number of important issues were raised. First, it is important to remember that the core must appeal to a wide variety of audiences, including students, faculty, parents, and administrators (among others). In addition, each of these audiences may very well have different goals/needs that the core must address. Therefore, the core must be developed with all of these needs in mind. Equally important, however, is how the core is presented to these audiences. This will require careful planning. It would not be our goal to simply “pander” to the needs of these audiences (i.e., “give them what they want – no matter who we are”). Rather, it would be our goal to listen deeply to these needs, and then show how our new core can meet those needs.

The remainder of the meeting was spent in discussing the possible structure and content of the core.

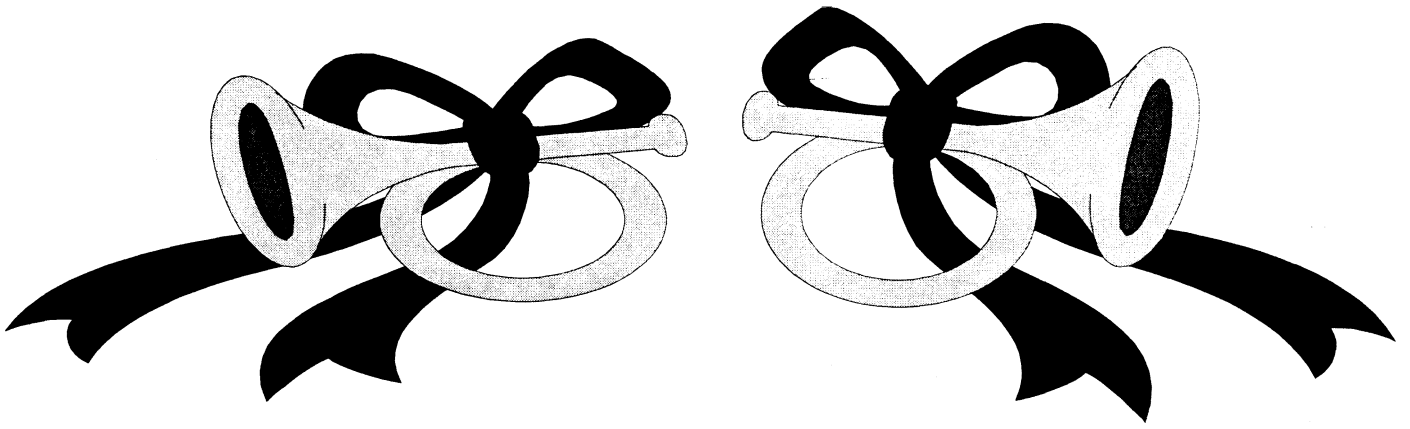
