

Designing an Effective Online Syllabus

**THURSDAY, MARCH 4
3:30-5:00 P.M., OLNEY 127**

If you're thinking about taking some or all of your courses online and aren't quite sure where to begin, this session is designed to get you started. Building a pedagogically effective online syllabus takes more than just posting a copy of your paper version to the World Wide Web. We'll look at some ways to take advantage of the hypermedia aspects of the web in creating an online syllabus. The session will also provide an opportunity for some hands-on exploration, so you may wish to bring a copy of a current syllabus (on a floppy disk) with which to experiment.

Although NRHH specifically recognizes resident students, non-resident students may become honorary members. All nominations are due by Wednesday March 17, so please submit references in advance. We are dependent upon all faculty and staff to make submissions, because you know the students better than we do. Your support is greatly appreciated.
