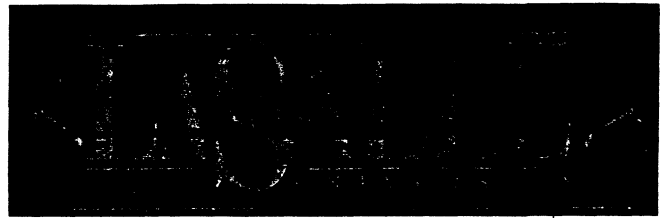
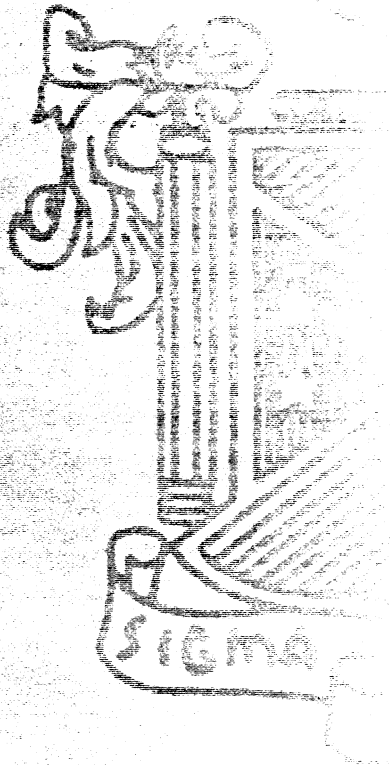

FACULTY POSITIONS

La Salle University seeks to fill two faculty positions in the Integrated Science, Business, and Technology Program (ISBT). This new interdisciplinary program incorporates team-building, project management, and computer technology throughout the curriculum. In addition to a solid foundation in science and business concepts, the ISBT program provides students with respect for the societal impact of science and technology. Applicants must be interested in building the ISBT program and creating a new and innovative undergraduate curriculum. The successful candidates must have expertise in one or more of the following interdisciplinary areas within ISBT: environmental science, information and knowledge management, and biotechnology.

Environmental Science: Applicants may possess background in environmental, chemical, or civil engineering; chemistry, environmental science, or ecology. Extensive computer-application experience is desired, especially in areas of environmental chemistry, air and water quality, risk assessment, or mapping.

Information and Knowledge Management: Applicants are sought with experience in knowledge-based systems, decision support systems, enterprise resource planning, project management, process control modeling, user interface design, or scientific visualization.

Biotechnology: Applicants are sought who have interests and experience in exploring the interrelationships between biotechnology and industry, agriculture, medicine, and the environment as well as in medical information, molecular biology and biochemistry.

The primary responsibility of faculty in ISBT will be teaching and curriculum development, with an emphasis on multidisciplinary approaches, problem-based learning and other innovative pedagogies. An interest in research is also desired. Applicants should possess multifaceted experience in science-related fields; experience in both higher education and industrial, business, or government sectors is preferred. The Ph.D. or equivalent experience is required.
