Dear Colleagues:

By way of this note, I am pleased to let you know about several major grants that were awarded to La Salle in recent months:

Independence Blue Cross: \$300,000 over three years for renovation/enhancement of the Fitness Center (project director: Thomas M. Brennan).

National Science Foundation, Mathematics Tutoring Initiative: \$149,472 over two years to support the Systemic Elementary Mathematics Team – Tutoring Initiative (project director: F. Joseph Merlino).


W. W. Smith Charitable Trust: \$94,000 for financial aid for academically qualified, middle income students enrolled as full-time undergraduates during the 1999-00 academic year (project director: Sara-Lyn Campagna).

United States Department of Health and Human Services, Professional Nurse Traineeship Program: \$81,476 for traineeship assistance for full-time students enrolled in the Master of Science in Nursing Program (project director: Janice M. Beitz).

Charlotte W. Newcombe Foundation: \$29,000 for scholarship assistance for mature, second career women enrolled during the 1999-00 academic year (project directors: Sara-Lyn Campagna and Elaine M. Mattern).

I'm sure you will all join me in congratulating the project directors on their successes. I do plan to publish similar announcements periodically as additional grants are awarded to the University. Please keep me posted so that I can make the list as complete as possible.

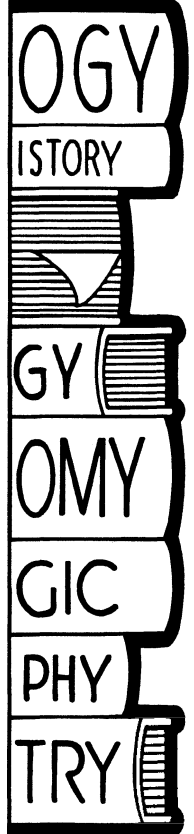

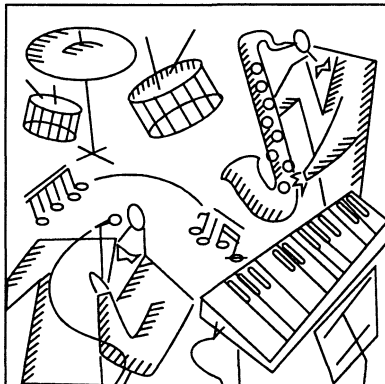

To: All Investigators Intending to Conduct Research at La Salle as Student, Faculty, Staff, or Outside Investigators

From: **Institutional Review Board (IRB)**

Re: IRB Application and Review

All researchers are required to submit completed research proposals and IRB application materials to La Salle University's IRB. This request refers to members of the La Salle Community and those from outside institutions who hope to use La Salle as a research setting and to obtain subjects for their investigations. Also, those students and faculty who plan to conduct research for course requirements or who intend to collect data from subjects and settings outside La Salle must also apply to the IRB for proposal review. Proposals may be exempt, expedited, or fully reviewed depending upon the nature of the research and the study design.

A completed application consists of the following documents:

1. IRB Application (packet available from Dr. Nancy Youngblood, Ext. 1112)
2. Consent form for participation in research
3. Research proposal or protocol with instruments to be used
4. Brief resume or biographical sketch of primary investigator(s)

Ten (10) copies of the completed application materials must be sent to:
