Carol began her tenure at La Salle College in 1981 as an undergraduate majoring in Chemistry in the Honors Program. Four years later, after serving as Editor-in-Chief of the yearbook and already working in the old Lawrence library, Carol graduated with Honors in Chemistry in 1985. It was then that she began her career as a professional librarian – though she didn't yet know it! She found herself working in every position possible in the library. She was in succession Acquisitions Technician, Stacks Supervisor, Systems Assistant, Acting Head of Access Services, and finally – after completing her Masters degree with a perfect 4.0 GPA at Drexel in 1997 – she became the permanent Head of Access Services.

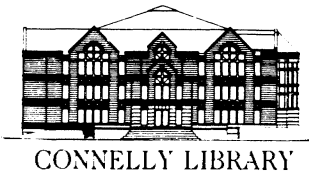
