La Salle University's School of Nursing receives two grants from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services

PHILADELPHIA -- La Salle University's School of Nursing has received two new grants for the 2000-01 academic year from the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The one is a grant of \$77,144 from the Advanced Education Nursing Traineeship Program and the other is \$7,966 from the Nurse Anesthetist Traineeship Program.

Both grants will provide scholarship assistance to students enrolled on a full-time basis in the graduate nursing program. The smaller grant is for students taking anesthesia specialty courses made available through a partnership with the Montgomery Hospital School of Anesthesia.

"These grants are important to the School of Nursing because they allow students with financial challenges to stay enrolled and take more classes per semester than they would otherwise be able to," said Janice Beitz, Director of the Graduate Nursing program. "They also give more people access to graduate studies."

La Salle University's Graduate Nursing Program provides coursework and field experience that prepare graduates to fill a variety of roles in the evolving health care and pharmaceutical industry, and keep on the cutting edge of the latest developments. Graduate nursing students can specialize in Adult Health and Illness/Clinical Nurse Specialist, MSN in Nursing Administration/MBA, Nurse Anesthesia, Primary Care of Adults-Nurse Practitioner, Primary Care of Families-Nurse Practitioner and Public Health Nursing.

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is the United States government's principal agency for protecting the health of all Americans and providing essential human services, especially for those who are least able to help themselves. HHS is the largest grant-making agency in the federal government, providing some 60,000 grants per year.
