As required by Section 402 of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974, Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Veterans Employment Opportunity Act, we are providing you with the following information.

The University takes affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified disabled veterans, veterans of the Vietnam era, handicapped individuals and, qualified veterans who served in a war, expedition, or campaign for which a campaign badge, service medal, or an expeditionary medal has been awarded. If you consider yourself to be a member of one of these four groups of individuals, please let us know. Submission of this information is voluntary and will be kept confidential, except that (i) supervisors and managers may be informed regarding restrictions on the work or duties of disabled veterans/non-veterans, and regarding necessary accommodations, (ii) first aid and safety personnel may be informed, when and to the extent appropriate, if the condition may require emergency treatment, and (iii) government officials investigating compliance with the Act shall be informed.

In order to assure proper placement of all employees, we request that you tell us if you have a disability which may affect your performance or create a hazard to yourself or others in connection with the job for which you are applying or performing. Additionally, please inform us of the following: (1) the skills and procedures you use or intend to use to perform a job notwithstanding the disability, (2) the accommodations we could make to enable you to perform your job properly and safely, including special equipment, changes in the physical layout of the job, elimination of certain duties relating to the job or other accommodations, and (3) any special methods, skills and procedures which qualify you for positions that you might not otherwise be able to do because of your handicap, so that you will be considered for any positions of that kind. ## **La Salle and Montgomery Hospital Awarded Federal Grant of Nearly \$1 Million To Enhance Nurse Anesthesia Program**

Philadelphia -- La Salle University and the Frank J. Tornetta School of Anesthesia at Montgomery Hospital have been awarded a 3-year federal grant of nearly \$ 1million to educate certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs) who will work in urban and medically underserved areas.

The grant, from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the Health Resources and Services Administration (a division of HHS), is guaranteed for the 2000-01 academic year, with the subsequent installments to be based on Congressional funding of the program for the second and third years.

The grants will help the schools expand existing programs and to double the size of the nurse anesthesia student body by end of the grant. La Salle started its master's degree program in nurse anesthesia last year. The Tornetta School in Norristown, PA., has been educating nurse anesthetists since 1951.

Dr. Janice Beitz, director of graduate nursing education at La Salle, said the grant has several goals for recruiting and educating nurses in this specialty, but primary among the outcomes is increasing the number of anesthesia nursing professionals who will work in urban, medically underserved areas.

"About a third of the nurses working this field are expected to retire in the next 10 years," said Beitz. Rural and urban areas will not have enough qualified CRNAs if more people aren't recruited and educated in this area. "There's a critical shortage of anesthesia nurse anesthetists, probably more critical than ever," said Michael Kost, director of the anesthesia program at the Tornetta school. About 65 percent of all surgery patients are anesthetised by CRNAs, said Kost.

Nurses have been performing the difficult task of anesthetising patients since the turn of the century. Many anesthesia nurses are male. Beitz said the grant will help recruit women and minorities to the field, and also recruit culturally diverse faculty members to the program as well. Additionally, the grant will help create a curriculum for educating nurses who will work in culturally diverse, medically underserved urban areas.

As a result of the University's restructured schedule, this term the Sheekey Writing Center will operate a day schedule that runs 9:00-4:00 Monday through Wednesday, 10:00-4:00 on Thursday, and 9:00-3:00 on Friday. In addition, the Center will offer evening sessions on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 5:15-6:45. The 5:15-6:45 time slot, by the way, consists of two 45 minutes sessions--one from 5:15-6:00 and the other 6:00-6:45--so students can choose which time frame best suits their needs. Students may use the Center on a drop-in basis but those students who wish to be assured of seeing a tutor should make reservations in advance, either by coming to the Writing Center or by calling X1299.

This term the Center will again conduct reading and study skills. These workshops are designed to help students read and study more efficiently and effectively. A workshop schedule is attached so that you can pass along the workshop information to your students. Please note that a workshop dealing with APA documentation has been added to the schedule. A reminder: Should students not be able to attend the workshops, they can always see a tutor during our regular hours for individual help with any of the topics covered in the workshops. We also have videotapes of some of the workshops which students may check out as well.

Student study guides can be provided upon request, as well as a CD-ROM presentation that includes information about Deaf culture, the challenges of the translation process, and Shakespeare's work and times. We are charging \$25 for each CD which covers the manufacturing cost to us.

### **Additional information about *Twelfth Night***

For the past two years, under the auspices of a grant from the Yale Digital Media Center and with the support of Amaryllis Theater Co., Peter Novak and a group of Deaf actors from around the country have worked tirelessly on developing a new method for doing a line-by-line translation of Shakespeare's *Twelfth Night* into American Sign Language. The goal is to provide a version of Shakespeare's play that is as close to the original as possible, leading to a performance of the piece in which every word of Shakespeare will be spoken by hearing actors in tandem with the performance in ASL. The result is an astonishing work designed for all audiences, Deaf and hearing alike, in which the best of Deaf performance art and the beauty of Shakespeare's language are combined.

The process itself, developed by Novak, involves a painstaking analysis and discussion of Shakespeare's words in which some of the nation's best Deaf actors, after sometimes heated debate, reached consensus on the most accurate and aesthetically pleasing ASL signs for translation. Given Shakespeare's love of word-play, pun, and at times convoluted metaphor, this was no easy task. At the end of each session, selected actors were videotaped signing a particular monologue, bit of dialogue, or scene, creating in effect a permanent translation or acting "text" of the play. Of course, the play only really assumes life on the stage. Using the videotaped sessions as a starting point, the translation will be fine-tuned and the play rehearsed for five weeks before coming to Philadelphia for its premiere. During the rehearsal process, the Deaf and hearing actors will work on synchronizing voice and sign, character and movement, in such a way that hearing audiences will both hear the words of each character and see the brilliant use of gesture and full body articulation that make ASL actors so visually electrifying. Deaf audience members of course will be able to enjoy a full-length, sophisticated translation of one of Shakespeare's most treasured plays.
