Subject: Summary of Sexual Assault Forum

Date: April 3, 2001

The following is a summary of the discussion from the University Forum on Sexual Violence that occurred on April 3, 2001 during the free time period. Approximately 40 faculty, staff and students came together in the Dunleavy Conference Room to discuss ways to improve La Salle University's response to sexual violence. Many ideas for prevention and intervention were generated. These include but are not limited to the following:

- A committee was formed to revise the *Guidelines for Students who have been Sexually Assaulted*. Suggestions for improvement include making the information easier to follow, including information on date rape and sexual harassment, making sure resources are up to date, and presenting the information in a more supportive manner. The revised version will be formatted into a brochure that can be easily distributed to all incoming students as well as made available in key spots throughout campus.
- A booklet will be written geared towards faculty and staff (*Guidelines for Faculty and Staff to support Students who have been Sexually Assaulted*) with the possibility of presenting it to faculty during the opening faculty meeting.
- The *Guidelines for Students who have been Sexually Assaulted* should be able to be accessed through the LaSalle Web page.
- Opportunities to promote a strong "No Tolerance" message concerning sexual assault and harassment need to be pursued. Connecting this message with Lasallian values was suggested. Posters with definitions of date rape, sexual assault and sexual harassment along with phone numbers of on and off campus resources need to be predominantly displayed throughout campus.
- A committee made up of members of SAVE, interested faculty, staff and students was formed to identify and review judicial policies relevant to Sexual Assault. Breaking down misperceptions about La Salle's judicial system as well as increasing awareness and communication of policies will be goals of the committee.

Several other suggestions and reactions were shared during the productive discussion. A follow up meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 30th – 1:00- 2:00 in the Union Center - Music Room .

La Salle University's Non Profit Management Development Center Receives \$322,300 Grant from William Penn Foundation

La Salle University's Non Profit Management Development Center (NMDC) was recently awarded a two-year grant totaling \$322,300 by the William Penn Foundation. The grant will be used to strengthen board leadership among non-profit organizations throughout the area and increase nonprofits' ability to meet the challenge of change.

Since 1981 the William Penn Foundation's support for La Salle's NMDC exceeds \$2,000,000.

"We have been working with the William Penn Foundation for a long time," said Karen Simmons, Executive Director of La Salle's NMDC since 1991. "Their continued support is greatly appreciated."

"There are over 8,000 non-profit organizations in the area and they all need qualified board members," said Simmons. "This grant will help us increase our management training for both executives and board members. We also want to expand our recruitment to include La Salle alumni."

The William Penn Foundation promotes understanding of and action on important issues facing the Philadelphia Region, as does La Salle's NMDC. In addition to other causes, NMDC works with mid-sized organizations focusing on arts, culture, environmental and human services. Because of their comparable vision for the betterment of the community, the William Penn Foundation's partnership with La Salle's NMDC will continue to increase the productivity of the Philadelphia area.

The grant will allow La Salle's NMDC, officially founded in 1986, to proceed to uphold its mission: "to increase the capacity of Delaware Valley nonprofit staff and board members, to manage and govern their organizations in a responsible, humanistic manner, so non-profits can better carry out their non-profit mission to serve the public good."



What's a GIS?

A Geographic Information System: A database in which information is linked to geographic coordinates (latitude and longitude, street addresses, etc.). GIS can be used to generate maps and analyze spatial attributes of data sets. Data are available from a wide variety of sources.

Many governmental and non-governmental agencies and businesses are now using GIS, which is **becoming a very valuable skill for our students to acquire.**
