ID CHANGE IN BANNER

In order to protect confidentiality and reduce the possibility of identity theft, the Banner Implementation Steering Committee has decided to change the primary Banner IDs from a Social Security Number-based ID to the 7-digit generated ID displayed on employee and student ID cards.

After the change, the Banner system will still contain SSN information, but SSN will no longer be utilized as the primary identifier. Starting Monday, May 5th, the Banner system will display a message notifying users that it has substituted the 7-digit ID number for the old ID number, whenever users enter an SSN-based ID.

Faculty, staff and students accessing the Br. LUWIS system should use their 7-digit ID number to log on to the system.

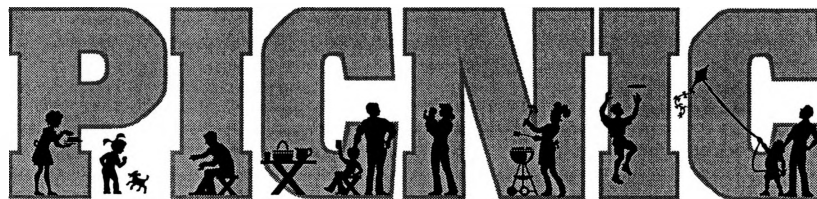

The Director supervises two professional staff members, 25 residential security and support staff members, and a corps of student workers. The members of the staff coordinate housing assignments and security access services for 2200 students housed in 11 residence halls, three apartment/townhouse complexes, and three leased towers in an external complex and administer an active and extensively utilized La Salle Union, serving a University community of nearly 6000 members and numerous guest groups. The Director leads the staff in carrying out those functions and in coordinating efforts with Community Development, University Life, Physical Facilities, Security, and other University personnel. The Director also leads and supports fellow division members in monitoring all divisional physical and fiscal resources, assists and advises the Dean of Students in administering all divisional budgets, and serves as a member of the divisional Leadership Team.

A master's degree in a relevant discipline and five years' significant related experience and success, or equivalent, form the basic requirements for a successful candidate.
